These DeKalb County, Missouri death notices and obituaries were extracted from all available newspapers on microfilm. We tried to get all of them, but sometimes the microfilm was not readable and some of the issues of the papers were missing.

The death notices were copied faithfully as written, but the dates may not be correct at all times, as some editors would say that it "happened last week" and we had to put the date of the newspaper it was reported in. That was as close as we could come to the actual date. Many names could have been spelled incorrectly, but were copied as spelled.

In Missouri the records of deaths were kept only from 1883 to 1893, and not until 1910 were they required by law to be kept again, and sent to Jefferson City. These death notices, maybe one of the only places that they can be found, unless in church records.

It is our sincere hope that this book will help someone with their tracing of ancestors in DeKalb County, Missouri.

1907 to 1910

ACORD, Sallna (nee Armstrong) --died 31 Dec 1909. She was born in Zainsville, Muskingum Co., Ohio, 13 Aug 1832 & came to Mo. & settled in Daviess Co. in the 40's. She married William Acord, 16 Jan 1851 & they had 9 children & all are living, but one Ida. William Acord died 10 Nov 1907. They moved to DeKalb Co. in 1882.

ALLEN, infant female --died 4 Feb 1909. The child of Mr & Mrs Link Allen.

ALLEN, Mrs C.A. (nee Eve Ann Folks) --died 15 Sept 1909 (fell to her death from a hay loft in a barn), near Union Star, Mo.. She was a sister of Mr B.L. Folk of Maysville, Mo.. She was born in Madison Co., Iowa, 17 Jan 1861. She was married 15 March 1877. She was the mother of 6 children & 5 are living now. Funeral at Oak Grove church & burial in the church cemetery.

ALLEN, Mrs Lenora --died 5 Jan 1909 at her home in Seattle, Wash., aged 30 years. She was a sister of J.M. Everett, who lives west of Stewartsville, Mo.

ALLISON, Jack --died 26 May 1907 at Grayson, killed by stabbing, by Dave Collier, aged about 35 years.

ALLISON, Mrs Sarah J. --died 20 Feb 1909, aged 71 years & 2 months, at St. Joseph's Hospital in St. Joseph, Mo.. She was born in Ranoke Co., Va., 20(?) Dec 1837. At the age of 16 her parents moved to Weston, Platte Co., Mo. & one year later to Alta Vista, Daviess Co., Mo.. She married Joshua B. DeHart, 22 Feb 1859 & to this union were born 2 children--- L.F. DeHart, who now is in St. Louis & Estella M. Dildine (?) (widow of the late F.S. Diladine) who lives on her farm near Weatherby, Mo.. At the start of the civil war Joshua enlisted in the Federal army as a member of Co. A, 35th Mo. Vol. & served til his death in Memphis, Tenn., 6 March 1863. Thirty seven years ago she purchased 40 acres of railroad land in Dallas Twp. & with her 2 children settled on it. She married T.J. Allison, 10 Dec 1871 & they had 3 children--- Alice Gertrude; Lola M. & Orpheus C. & all died at an early age. Burial in Hopewell cemetery.

ANDERSON, Ernest --died 18 Jan 1910 in the west part of Amity, Mo.. He was the 2nd son of Ben Anderson. Burial in New Hope cem.

ANDERSON, William --died 12 Sept 1910 at Gallatin, Mo.. He was the uncle of Pines R. Dunn.

ANDREWS, Mrs Mary --died 7 Feb 1908 at the home of her daughter, Mrs William Johnson, aged 75 years, 1 month & 22 days. She was born in Morrow Co., Ohio, 16 Dec 1832. She married Charles P. Andrews, 4 Dec 1853 & they had 3 children & 1 son died in infancy. Daughters, Mrs William Johnson, of Mt. Pleasant country east of Maysville, Mo. & Mrs William Dice, of Maysville. She with her family moved to DeKalb Co. in 1872. Her husband died, 29 Nov 1891. Burial in Maysville cemetery beside her husband.

ANSMUS, Phillip --died 29 April 1909 at his home in DeKalb Co., Mo.. He was born in Jacksonville, Ill., 25 Sept 1836. He married Jane Bradshaw, 5 Nov 1857. His wife died 13 months before him. They had 4 children, 2 boys & 2 girls. The girls both died in infancy. George the oldest son made his home with his father. Frank the youngest is in unknown parts as far as the family knows. If he is still living. He was a member of the Christian church.

ARMSTRONG, Mr Dee --died last week (reported in the 3 Nov 1910 paper) at his home near Cameron, Mo.. He was formerly of Fairport, Mo.

ARMSTRONG, Elder Joshua --died 5 Aug 1907 at his home in Stewartsville, Mo., aged 67 years, 2 months & 1 day. He was born in Madison Co., Ill., 4 June 1840 & moved with his parents to Putnam Co., Mo. in 1855. He married Miss Jennette Henness in 1861. She was the mother of 12 children & 6 have preceded him in death. Of the surviving 6 children, 5 were present at the funeral--- one daughter, Mrs G.N. Doudna, of Lees Summit was unable to get here, being in Kendrick, Idaho. Children present were--- Mrs E.D. Briggs, of Nebr. City, Nebr.; Mrs Mary Cain, of Meadow, Nebr.; Mrs O.E. Haden, of St. Joseph, Mo. & E.J. Armstrong, of Stewartsville. His eldest sister, Mrs E.G. Schaal & husband & his brother William of Springfield, Nebr. & 2 granddaughters from Omaha, Nebr. were also present. In 1865 Joshua moved to Eastern Nebr. & lived there for 30 years, moving to Jackson Co., Mo. in 1895 & from there to Stewartsville in 1902. Funeral at the L.D.S. church & burial in City cemetery.

ARNOLD, Jonathan --died 1 July 1908, near Bayfield, aged about 82 years. Mr Arnold was one of the oldest settlers of this area. He was born in Loudon Co., Va., 27 Aug 1828. He married Margaret A. Compher, 11 Dec 1851. Children are Emma; William F.; Alice May; John N.C. & Silas C.. He is survived by his wife & 4 children. He moved from Va. to Ohio in 1860 & to Mo. in 1861. Burial in Salem cemetery.

ARNOLD, Oscar --died 1 Aug 1909, south of Union Star, Mo., aged 17 years, 2 months & 1 day. He was born 31 May 1892, the son of Mr & Mrs Ruben Arnold. Burial in Oak Grove cemetery.

ASBURY, Joseph W. --died 15 Aug 1910 near Ford City, of typhoid fever. He was the son-in-law of Mr & Mrs Head . He was born in Clinton Co., Mo., 17 April 1880 & as a boy came to DeKalb Co. He married Miss Minnie Head & they had 3 children. One boy died in infancy last spring. His 5 brothers acted as pallbearers. Burial in King City, Mo. cemetery.

ATTERBURY, Green B. --died 4 Feb 1909 at his home, 1611 Faron St. in St. Joseph, Mo.. He was born in Howard Co., Mo., 10 Sept 1840. At the age of 4 years he was taken with his parents to Maysville, Mo., which was his home for 50 years. He enlisted in the union army at the outbreak of the civil war & was Adjutant of the 1st. Mo. Cav. under Col. James McFerran. He was

mustered out as Captain at the close of the war. When 25 years old Mr Atterbury was elected to the General Assembly from DeKalb Co. & served 2 terms, 1866 to 1870. In 1871 he was elected sheriff & collector of DeKalb Co., which he held 2 years. He was postmaster of Maysville, Mo. during the Harrison administration. In 1894 he moved to St. Joseph & with his son, Elmer D. Atterbury, established the commission house of Atterbury & Co.. He leaves a wife, 2 sons & 2 daughters. Mr Atterbury had been twice married & of the first union, there was a son F. Atterbury, of Johannesburg, South Africa. Of the second marriage--- Miss Etta Atterbury; Mrs George W. Eastin & Elmer D. Atterbury, all of St. Joseph, Mo.

ATTERBURY, Laura May --died 4 April 1907 at Sedalia, Mo., aged 29 years. She was born 24 Oct 1878 at Wellington, Kan.. She died while on a visit with her brother A.A. Atterbury in Sedalia. She lived in Osborn, Mo.. Her father, 2 brothers & 1 sister have preceded her in death. She leaves her mother, Mrs Mary Atterbury, 6 brothers & 2 sisters.

AUGHINBAUGH, Mrs Catherine (nee Julius) --died 27 Jan 1909 at her home near Stewartsville, Mo., aged 96 years. She was born in Hagerstown, Md., 8 April 1812. She married James Aughinbaugh & from this union were born 10 children & 5 of them, with the father have preceded her in death. She with her family came to Mo. in 1856. Funeral at the Independence Church & burial in Church cemetery beside her husband.

BAKER, Milton Devore --died 18 Nov 1910, aged 74 years. He was born in Callaway Co., Mo., 29 Aug 1836. He came to DeKalb Co., Mo. at the age of 12 years & has lived on his home farm for 63 years. He married Elenore Vance, 15 Jan 1860. They had 12 children, 7 girls & 5 boys. Isabel & Nina May died in infancy & Claude died 19 March 1901. Those remaining are Mrs Popplewell; Mrs Craig; Mrs Mark; Mrs Vance; Mrs Hadly & Robert; Milton; Albert & William Baker. Burial in Stewartsville, Mo.

BAKER, female --died 9 July 1910, north of Cameron, Mo.. The infant daughter of Mr & Mrs Ralph Baker (drowned).

BARGER, Emmett Allen --died 10 March 1909 in Spokane, Wash. at the home of his daughter, Mrs G.A. Gardener (formerly Miss Maudene Barger). He was born 23 Nov 1864(?) in Penn. & moved to Mo. when quite young & resided in DeKalb Co. for over 40 years. He married Orleen McMillen, 8 May 1869(?), who has preceded him in death in Feb of 1906. To this union were born 6 children & 4 are still living--- C.E. Barger; Mrs Adolph Miller, of Morton, Idaho; C.B. Barger, of Harrington, Wash.; Mrs G.A. Gardener, of Spokane, Wash.. He had moved to Spokane about one year ago. Burial in Fairmount cemetery at Spokane.

BARGER, Orlean --died 24 March 1907 at the home of her parents, Mr & Mrs C.E. Barger, 02911 Perry St., Spokane, Wash.. She was a niece of Miss Maudene Barger. Orlean was born 4 July 1901. Burial in Fairmont cemetery in Spokane.

BARRY, John --died 24 Aug 1910 at his home in Camerom, Mo.. He had formerly lived near Osborn, Mo.. He is the father of Mrs Frank Moore of south of Osborn.

BARTHOLEMEW, Harvey --died 14 Dec 1909, aged about 43 years at the County Farm. He was born & reared in DeKalb Co., Mo.. Burial in the new cemetery at Maysville, Mo..

BASHAW, Mrs James --died 2 Nov 1910 at Fairport, Mo., aged abt. 60 years. She was a sister of Robert Smith; Mrs Hopkins, of Fairport, Mo. & Mrs John Wolfe, of Maysville, Mo.. Burial in Smith cemetery.

BASHOR, John Schorn --died 28 July 1910, aged 54 years. He was born 17 April 1856 in Washington Co., Tenn.. He moved with his parents to Andrew Co., Mo. in 1865. He married Miss Julia Ella Wilson, 8 July 1877. He leaves his wife, 1 son, 1 daughter, 3 brothers & 1 sister. Burial at the Whitesville Baptist church.

BASJOR, Martin --died 19 Jan 1910 at his home in Longmont, Colo., aged 92 years. He is the father of John & Wash Bashor of Union Star, Mo.

BAUER, Garman --died 23 Sept 1909, aged 55 years. He was born in Wilkesbarrie, Penn., 28 July 1854. He came to Mo. with his parents, 8 March 1869 & settled on a farm 2 miles north of Stewartsville. He married Sophia Knorr, 19 March 1882. He leaves his wife, 8 children, 2 brothers & 4 sisters. Funeral in Ridgeville church & burial in cemetery there.

BEATTY, Mrs Maria A. --died 19 Feb 1907, aged 74 years, at the home of her only living child, Mrs J.S. Shearer, in Maysville, Mo.. She was born Maria A. Sutherland in Stubenville, Ohio, 4 Aug 1832. She married William H. Beatty in Stubenville, Ohio & he died 16 March 1883 in Nebr.. They had 5 children, 2 dying in infancy. After their marriage, they moved to Leesville, Ohio & lived there a number of years, then to Ind. & lived there a short time. They came to Maysville, Mo. about 30 yrs. ago & remained here for a few years. Then to Nebr. & after the death of her husband & of 2 sons, who died 11 March 1902, she returned to Maysville, Mo., to her daughters. She is survived by a brother, George Sutherland, of Stubenville, Ohio & a sister, Mrs Belle Maples, of Hamondville, Ohio. Mrs Beatty was a cousin of the late Dr. Hugh Fisher, of Kansas, who was a pioneer preacher of the west. Burial in Fairbury, Nebr. beside her husband and two sons.

BENTLY, Silas --died 21 May 1909 at Las Vegas, N. Mex.. He was born in Holt Co., Mo., 3 Sept 1878 & was 30 years old at the time of his death. He married Nellie Mullnix, 4 Jan 1905 & one

child was born to them. He has been a resident of Flag Springs & vicinity since 1889. Burial at Flag Springs cemetery.

BENTLY, Mrs Sophia --died 28 March 1910 in St. Joseph, Mo., aged 67 years. She was formerly Miss Sophia Dawes, sister of Mrs J.H. Handel. Burial at Flag Springs.

BILLS, William --died 18 March 1909 in St. Joseph, Mo.. He was born 30 June 1864 at St. Marys, W. Va., where he grew to manhood. Moved then to Colo., living there 8 years. He then came to Mo.. He married Miss Effie A. Melcher, 27 Nov 1901. To them were born 2 children, a boy & a girl. He leaves his wife & children, 5 brothers & 1 sister. Burial in St. Joseph (?).

BOHN, Mrs Anna Margaret --died 1 July 1910 at her home near Osborn, Mo., aged 73 years. She was born in Germany, 19 Oct 1836. She was married in Germany in 1864 & she had a son & a daughter & both survive her. She came to the US in 1868, settling on a farm near Osborn. Her husband has preceded her in death.

BOONE, Mrs Elizabeth (nee Pannell) --died 9 July 1910 east of Union Star, Mo., wife of Col. Henry Boone. She was born at St. Mary, Ste. Genevieve Co., Mo. in 1832. She was married early in life to William Parson & they had 3 children. William died at Corpus Christe at the age of 28. In 1868 she married Henry Boone, who with a son & a daughter survive her. She was the mother of Dr. Charles Boone, of Albany, a sister of Mrs Sallie Massey, of Kan. City, & her daughter Mrs Mary Massey. At the funera; came Robert Pannell & wife of Excelsior Springs, Mo.; Joseph Pannell & wife & daughter, of St. Joseph, Mo.; Mrs Charles Boone, of Aullville; Mrs Armstrong & daughter, of Darlington; Dr. & Mrs Larmer, of Albany. Services at the Christian church & burial in the cemetery north of Union Star, Mo.. When she was Mrs Parsons, settled on a large tract of land east of the present location of Union Star in 1854. She was in the early life and development of this country.

BONNEY, Justice --died 17 July 1907 (burned in an explosion of gasoline when trying to light a fire ia a stove) at the home of his parents, Mr & Mrs William S. Bonney in Perrin, Mo.. He was born in Shabbons, Santalict Co., Mich., 15 Sept 1899. He leaves his parents, 4 sisters & 2 brothers. Funeral at the M.E. church in Perrin.

BOWMAN, Jesse M. --died 26 Oct 1910 at Flag Springs. He was born in Andrew Co., Mo., 16 July 1878, the son of Mr & Mrs Reece Bowman, who were married 6 July 1865 & well known in this community. Reece Bowman & wife had 9 children, 1 son George Henry, died 2 March 1882. Other children are Mrs Matie Barker, of King City, Mo.; J.W. Bowman, of Union Star, Mo.; Mrs Lizzie Wayman, of Albany, Mo.; Mrs Annie Purviance, of S. Dak.; J.L. Bowman, of King City; Effie B. Bowman, of Union Star; Mrs Mary Hulett, of Albany,

also a half-brother in Oregon & a half-sister in Kan. City. Jesse was buried beside his father & brother at Flag Springs.

BOWMAN, J.S. --died 24 Jan 1907 at Tulsa, I.T., aged 63 years. He had been a resident of DeKalb Co., Mo. until he moved with his family 14 years ago to Tulsa. He had been a soldier in the civil war. He leaves a wife, 3 sons & 5 daughters--- Mrs Sidney Belk, of Cameron, Mo.; Mrs Geroge M. Miller, of Cameron, Mo.; Mrs Frank Howard, of Tulsa; Mrs Earl Stults, of Okla.; Miss Alice Bowman, of Tulsa; William & Thomas of the home; Samuel Bowman, of Lewistown, Mont.. Burial in Tulsa cemetery, 25 Jan 1907.

BRAY, Malthus F. --died (reported in the 16 May 1907 paper) at his home in Parsons, Kan., one of the earliest settlers of Labette Co.. He was born in Cheatham Co., N. Carolina, 12 July 1831. When he was one year of age, his parents moved to Hendricks Co., Ind., where he grew to manhood. He married Miss Marticia Duncan, 10 March 1853. To them were born 10 children, 8 of whom with the wife survive him. Children are S.M. Bray, of Brewster, Wash.; Mrs Ollie Meyers, of Colo. Springs, Colo.; John Bray, of Labette City, Kan.; Mrs D.H. Houston, of Florence, Colo.; Mrs H.M. Gregg of Coffeyville, Kan.; Albert Bray, Jennie Bray & Mrs J.W. Bennett, of Parsons, Kan.. He served from 1861 to 1865 as corporal in Co. G., 99th Ind. Inf.. With his family in 1869 he came to Kan. & homesteaded near what now is Montana Station, until 7 years ago when he moved to Parsons. He was 4th in a family of brothers & was second to die. Surviving brothers are Atlas and Matt in Ind.; Samuel in Mo. & Jim & Eads near Labette City, Kan.

BRIDGES, Ermel Leo --died 6 Sept 1907, the son of Mr & Mrs Asa Bridges. He was born 6 Oct 1904. Burial in old cemetery at Maysville, Mo.

BROWN, Clara Maude --died 20 April 1909, aged 3 years. She was born 7 Feb 1906, the daughter of Mr & Mrs Oscar Brown. Burial in Lebanon cemetery.

BROWN, George W. --died 16 Nov 1909, of northeast of Union Star, Mo., hit by a train. He was born in Union Co., Ill., 26 March 1866. He came to Mo. in 1884. He married Mattie Sharp in March of 1894. They lived in St. Joseph, Mo. for several years. He was the brother-in-law of Henry & Andy Sharp. He leaves his wife & children. Burial at Union Chapel.

BROWN, James --died 23 Aug 1907, aged 25 years, at the home of his parents, Mr & Mrs John S. Brown, who live 7 miles northeast of Stewartsville, Mo.. He was a member of the Lodge 525 I.O.F., of Osborn, Mo.. This is the second death in this family, a dau. died a month ago. Burial at Lebanon Church, south of Stewartsville, Mo.

BROWN, L.H. --died (reported in the 4 Jan 1907 paper) at his home in Booneville. He was born in Canada, 5 June 1826 & had lived in DeKalb Co., Mo. since 1855. He had been a resident of Booneville for the past 7 years. He leaves his wife, 8 daughters, Mrs G.A. Cautlas; Mrs J.T. Nicholas; Mrs J.L. Davis, of Larmine; Mrs A.J. Spry, of Nelson; Mrs Samantha Wilson, of Richmond; Thomas ; William Vaugh & Joseph Beers. He leaves 2 brothers--- J.H. & M.O. Brown of Stewartsville & a sister, Mrs Marilla Teal, of Rochester, N.Y.

BROWN, Mrs Ollie C. --died 13 Nov 1909 at her home in Maysville, Mo., aged 49 years. With the exception of a very few years she had spent her full life in DeKalb Co., Mo.. She was born Ann Eliza Reynolds, 4 miles south of Maysville, 17 March 1860. She married Ollie C. Brown, 28 Oct 1880 & they had 4 children--- Mrs Charles Daniels; Mrs Louis Sherard; Mrs O.E. Heins & 1 son, Louis, who died at the age of 3 years. Funeral at the M.E. church South & burial in new cemetery at Maysville, Mo.

BROWN, Mrs T.A. --died 1 Nov 1907. She was born Elizabeth Stafford, 7 March 1861(?) in Syracuse, N.Y. & moved when but a child with her parents to Sycamore, Ill.. At about the age of 14 the family moved to Maryville, Kan.. She married T.A. Brown, 26 April 1875(?) & moved to Maysville, Mo.. They had 5 children & all survive her. Burial in Maysville cemetery.

BULL, Mrs Sidney --died 27 May 1910 near Cameron, Mo.. Burial at Amity, Mo. cemetery.

BURK, Mrs Catherine Keener --died 11 Jan 1907. She was born in Penn. in 1834. She came to DeKalb Co., Mo. in 1844. She married Franklin P. Burk in 1851. They had 11 children, 3 boys and 8 girls. All but one boy who died in infancy survive her. The children are Mrs Addie Noel, of DeKalb Co., Mo.; Mrs Sarah Botts of Okla.; Mrs Lillian Fly, of Mont.; Mrs Mary Emery, of Texas; Mrs Lucy Phillips, of Mont.; Mrs Rosa Severe, of St. Louis, Mo.; Mrs Ella Gantz, of Cameron, Mo. & Miss Fannie Burk, who lives at home; William Burk, of DeKalb Co., Mo. & Marion Burk, of Mont.. She was a member of the M.E. South church at Winslow. Burial at Winslow cemetery.

BURNETT, Mrs Evelyn Ethelyn (nee Shackelford) --died 8 March 1910, aged 22 years. She was born 8 Oct 1887, the oldest child of Mr & Mrs Robert Shackelford. She married T.A. Burnett, 17 June 1907. She leaves her husband, parents, 1 brother & 3 sisters. Funeral at the M.E. church in Stewartsville & burial in the Presbyterian cemetery.

BURHAM, Henry C. --died 26 Aug 1908 at Gunnison, Colo.. He was born in McKean Co., Penn., 9 May 1835. He grew to manhood in western Penn. & was the oldest of 4 children, all of whom are now dead. He married Charlotte Moses in Jan of 1862, who now survives him. In 1868 he moved to DeKalb Co., Mo., settling on

a farm near Fairport. He was twice judge of the County Court & several times justice of the peace & many years a notary public. Judge Burnham was made a Mason in his younger days in the state of Penn.. He was a member of Parrot Lodge No. 308 of Maysville, Mo.. Also a member of Chapter No. 77, Royal Arch Masons of Maysville.

BURR, Robert --died 22 Oct 1910 at his home, 6 miles southwest of Osborn, Mo., aged 65 years. Funeral at the Smith Fork church. Burial in Osborn cemetery.

BUTLER, Mrs Rachel M. --died 4 Oct 1908 at her home south of Hemple, Mo., aged 78 years. She was born Rachel McClure in Havana, Schuyler Co., N.Y., 30 April 1830, the daughter of Thomas & Rachel McClure. She married Squire T. Butler in the place of her birth, 14 Oct 1848 & her children were born there also. They had 6 children, but 2 have died, Frank died at 2 years in 1858 & the only daughter, Mrs Ella Thorpe died in 1886. Her husband died in 1900. The 4 surviving sons are--- Charles A., of Liberal, Kan.; William N., of St. Joseph, Mo.; George M., of Deadwood, S. Dak. & Norris T., of Blackwell, Okla. She also raised the 4 small children of her daughter who died & the grandchildren are--- Mrs C.C. Moore, of Blackwell, Okla; Frank & Clarence Thorpe, of Lead, S. Dak. & Elmer, of Oregon, Ill.. Mrs Butler followed her husband, who had moved from Havana, N.Y. to Denver, Colo. in 1863. He had gone there in 1860 during the gold rush.
