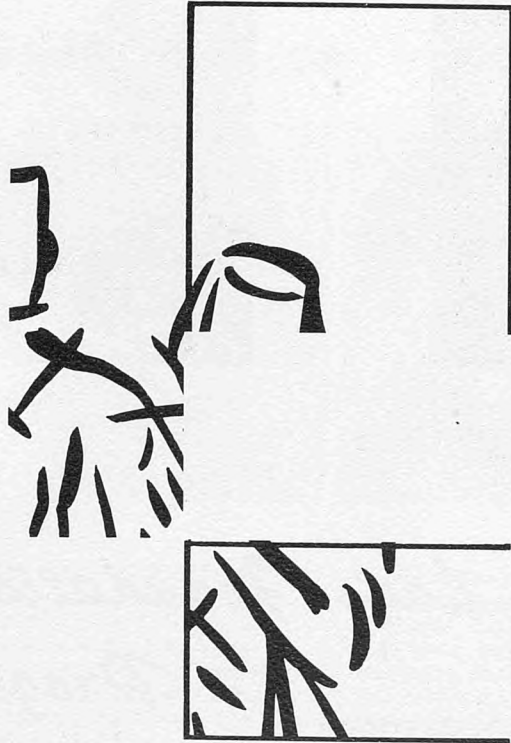
Kindergarten Pupils Prepare for First Grade

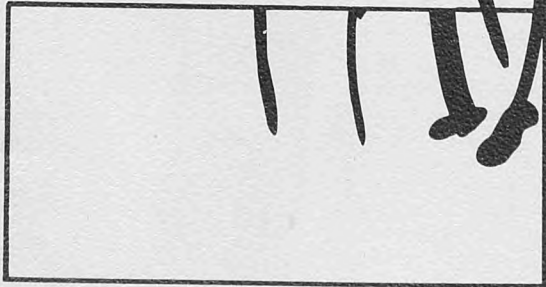
On Friday, July 14, the group toured the St. Joseph Museum.

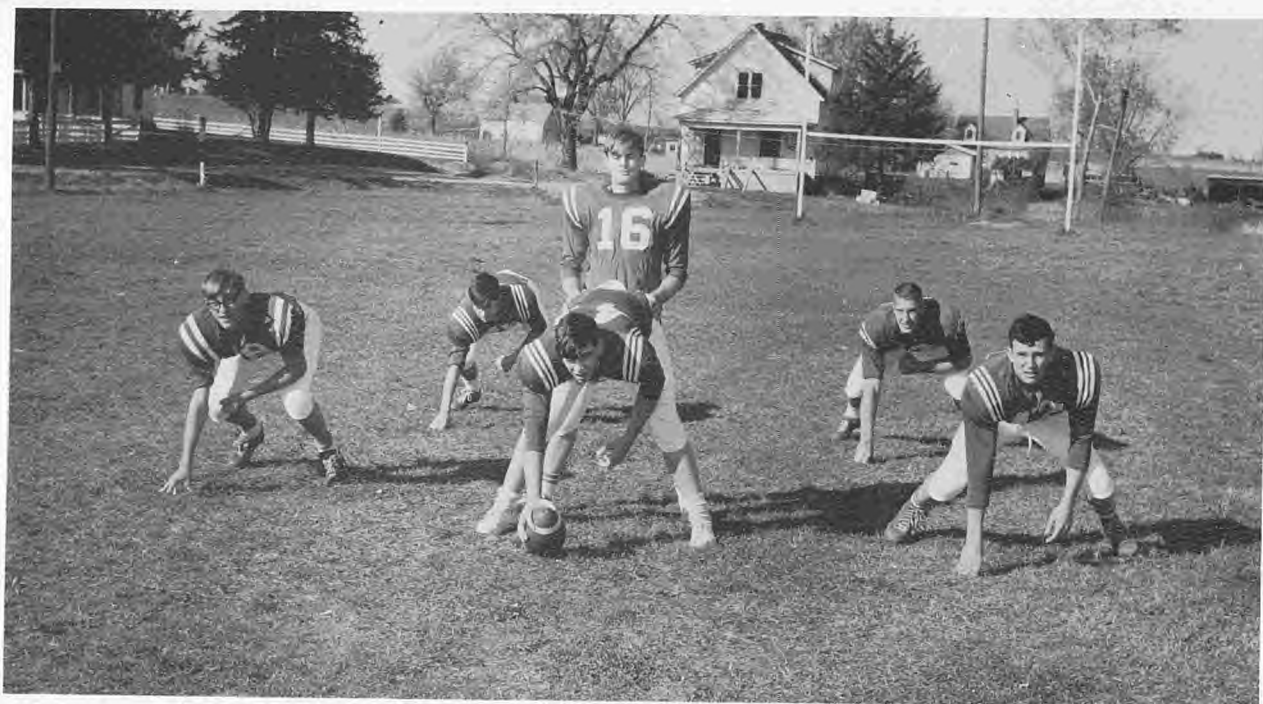

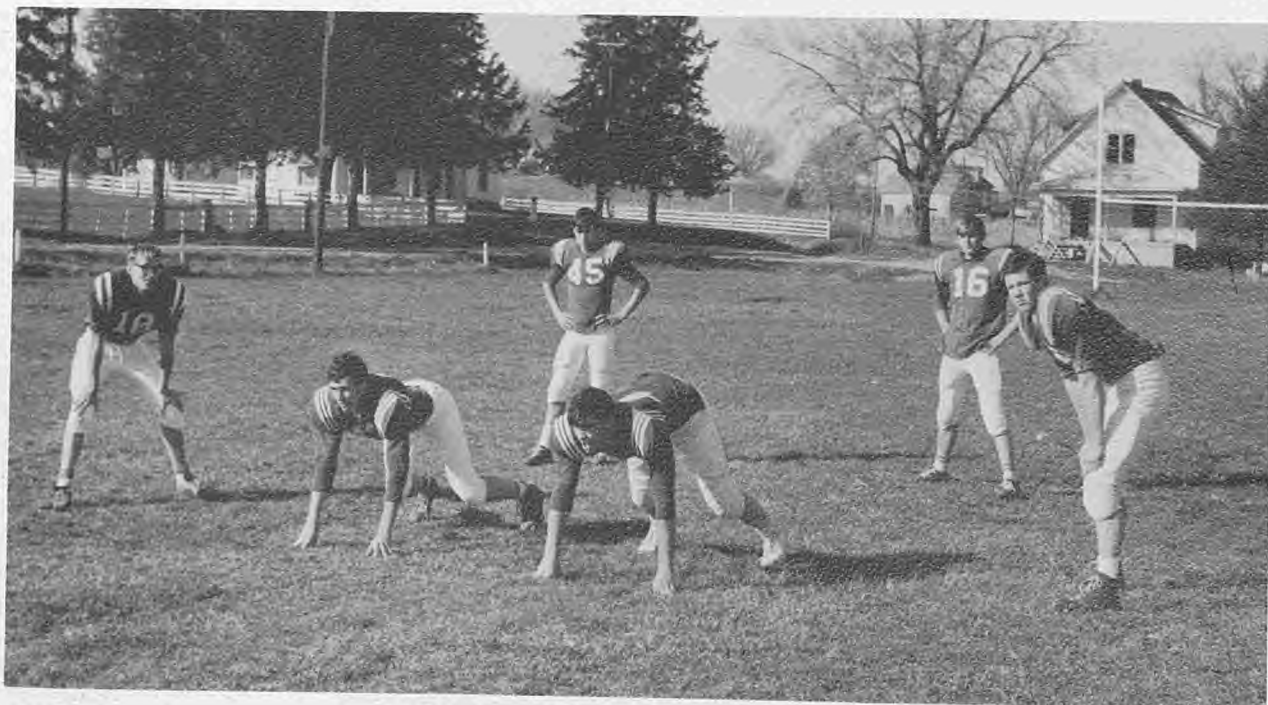

Boys Win Second in Regional

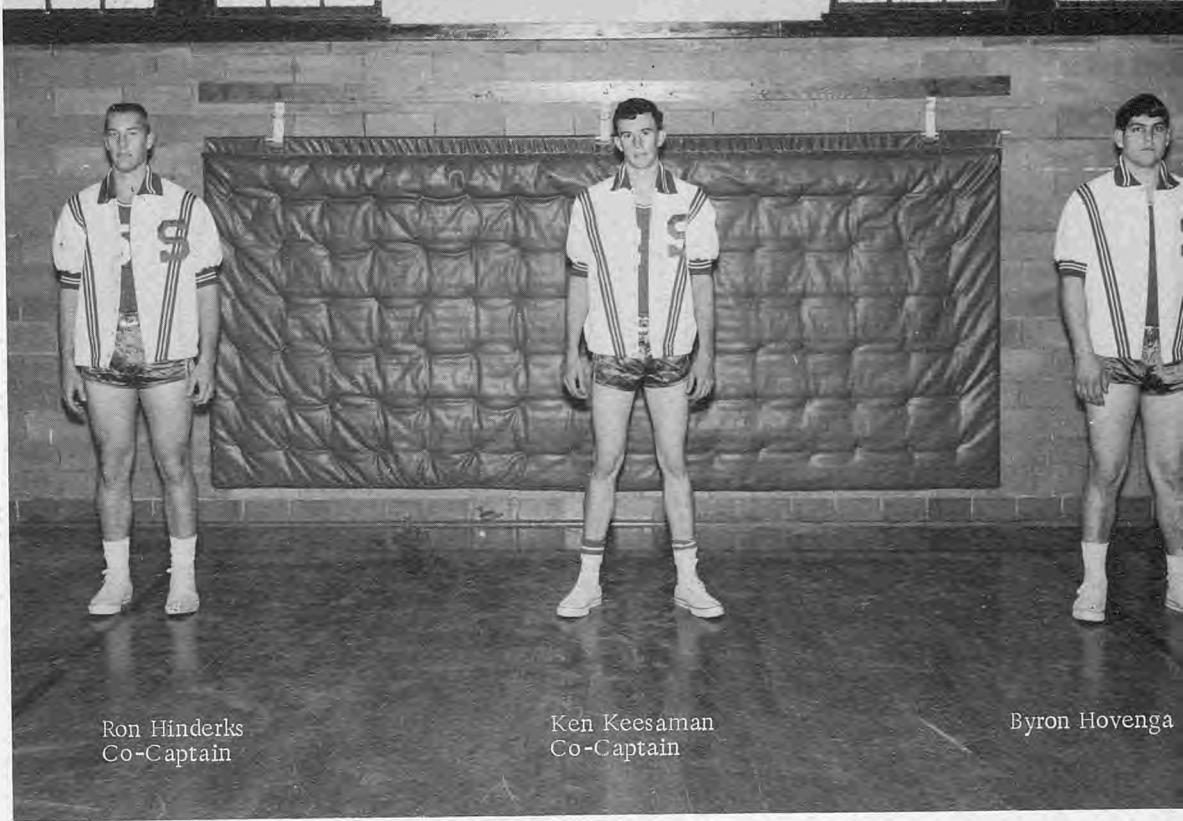
Stewartsville took the PVC Conference Championship with a record of 8-0.

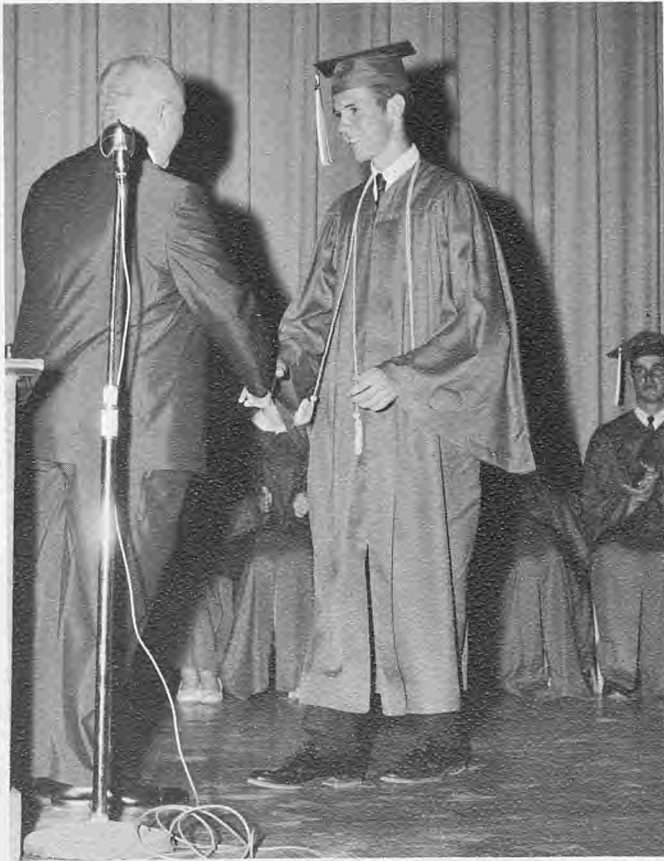

The processional and recessional were played by Jenan Powell and Gail Thompson and Doug Pickett sang vocal solos.

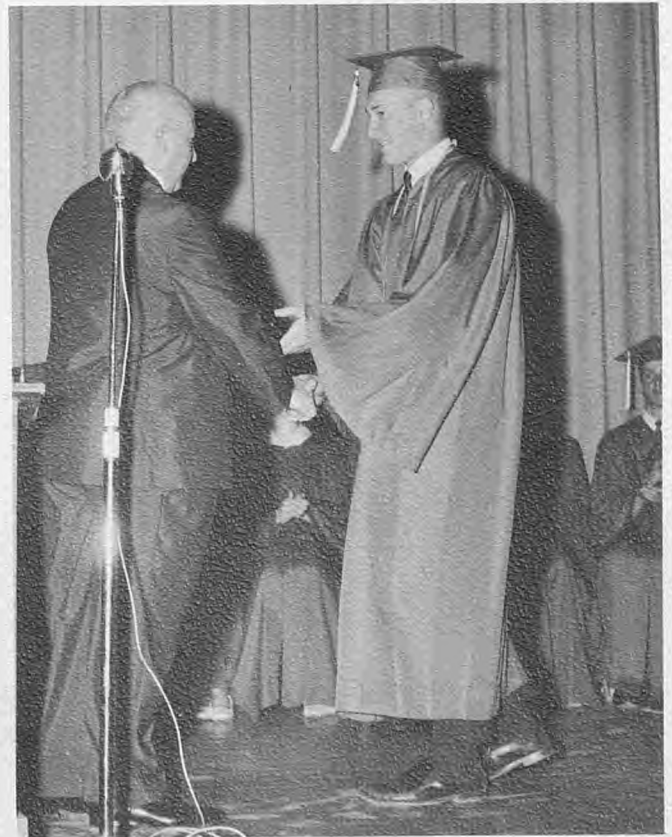

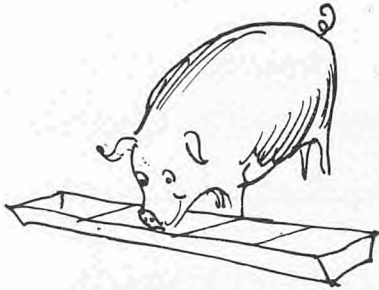

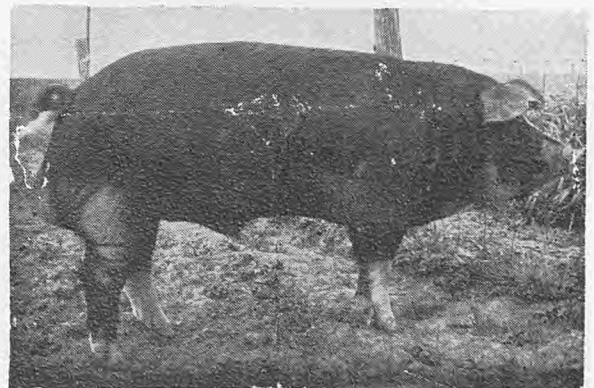
