





Jolene Powell Crowned Miss Cardinal At Christmas Dance


When the music began at eight o'clock on Saturday night, December 16, seven excited girls were escorted across the gym and onto the stage for the coronation ceremony.






On Friday, July 14, the group toured the St. Joseph Museum.













The processional and recessional were played by Jenan Powell and Gail Thompson and Doug Pickett sang vocal solos.




