EXCERPTS FROM THE LAST WILL AND TESTAMENT
of
GEORGE WASHINGTON

(Through the courtesy of Mrs. Robert D. Haire, a lineal descendant of Colonel John Washington, great-grandfather of George Washington and who settled in Virginia in 1659. Mrs. Haire is descended from Betty Carter, daughter of Washington's sister, Betty Lewis, and grand-daughter of Augustine Washington.)

own view of the subject shall be adequate and final. —— The negroes thus bound are (by their masters or mistresses) to be taught to read and write and to be brought up to some useful occupation, agreeably to the laws of the commonwealth of Virginia, providing for the support of orphans and other poor children — and I do hereby expressly forbid the sale or transportation out of the said Commonwealth of any Slave I may die possessed of, under any pretense, whatsoever — and I do moreover most positively, and most solemnly enjoin it upon my Executors hereafter named, or the survivors of them to see that this clause respecting slaves and every part thereof be religiously fulfilled at the Epoch at which it is directed to take place without evasion neglect or delay after the crops which may then be on the ground are harvested, particularly as it respects — the aged and infirm, seeing that a regular and permanent fund be established for their support so long as there are subjects requiring it, not trusting to the uncertain provisions to be made by individuals. —— And to my mulatto man, William (calling himself William Lee) I give immediate freedom or if he should prefer it(on account of the accidents which have befallen him and which have rendered him incapable of walking or of any active employment) to remain in the situation he now is, it shall be optional in him to do so — In either case however I allow him an annuity of thirty dollars during his natural life which shall be independent of the vituals and cloaths he has been accustomed to receive; If he chuses the last alternative, but in full with his freedom, if he prefers the first, and this I give him as a testimony of my sense of his attachment to me and for his faithful services during the Revolutionary War.

* * * * *

ITEM -- If Charles Carter who intermarried with my niece, Betty Lewis, is not sufficiently secured in the title to the lots he had of me in the town of Fredericksburg, it is my will and desire that my Executors shall make such conveyances of them as the law requires to render it perfect.

* * * * *

ITEM -- To Fielding Lewis, George Lewis, Robert Lewis, Howell Lewis & Betty Carter, sons and daughter of my deceased sister Betty Lewis I give & bequeath five other parts — one to each of them.



ITEM— To my brother Charles Washington I give and bequeath the Gold-headed cane left me by Doct'r Franklin in his will; I add nothing to it because of the ample provision I have made for his issue ——" To the Acquaintances and friends of my juvenile years, Lawrence Washington and Robert Washington of Chotanck, I give my other two gold-headed canes, having my arms engraved on them, and to each (as they will be useful where they live), I leave one of the spy glasses which constituted part of my equipage during the late war — To my compatriot in arms and intimate friend Doct'r Craik, I give my Bureau (or as the Cabinet makers callsd it Tambour Secretary) and the circular chair, an appendage of my study — To Doct'r David Stuart I give my large shaving and dressing table, and my Telescope — To the Reverend, and now Bryan Lord Fairfax I give a Bible in three large folio volumes with notes, presented me by the Right Reverend Thomas Wilson, Bishop of Sodor & Man — To General de la Fayette I give a pair of finely wrought steel pistols taken from the enemy in the Revolutionary War —



The family Vault at Mount Vernon requiring repairs, and being improperly situated besides, I desire that a new one of Brick, and upon a larger scale, may be built at the foot of what is commonly called the Vineyard Inclosure, — on the ground which is marked out. — In which my remains, with those of my deceased relatives (now in the Old Vault) and such others of my family as may chuse to be entombed there, may be deposited. And it is my express desire that my Corpse may be interred in a private manner, without parade or funeral oration. —

LASTLY--- I constitute and appoint my dearly beloved wife Martha Washington, my nephews William Augustine Washington, Bushrod Washington, George Steptoe Washington, Samuel Parke Custis (when he shall have arrived at the age of twenty years) Executrix & Executors of this Will & Testament, — In the construction of which it will readily be perceived that no professional character has been consulted or has had any agency in the Draught — and that, although it has occupied many of my leisure hours to digest & to through it into the present form, it may notwithstanding appear crude and incorrect — But having endeavored to be plain



and explicit in all the Devises --- even at the expense of prolixity, perhaps of tautology, I hope, and trust, that no disputes will arise concerning them; but if contrary to expectation the case should be otherwise from the want of legal expression, or the usual technical terms or because too much or too little; has been said on any of the devises to be consonant with law, my will and direction expressly is, that all disputes (if unhappily any should arise) shall be decided by three impartial and intelligent men, known for their probity and good understanding; two to be chosen by the disputants, each having the choice of one, and the third by those two. --- which three men thus chosen, shall unfettered by law or legal constructions, declare their sense of the Testator's intention; and such decision is, to all intents and purposes to be as binding on the parties as if it had been given to the Supreme Court of the United States. --- In witness of all and each of the things herein contained I have set my hand and seal this nineth day of July, in the year one thousand seven hundred and ninety and of the Independence of the United States, the Twenty fourth.

EARLY SETTLERS IN AMERICA

of the

SAPPINGTON FAMILY

The earliest settler in America was found in Cecil County, Maryland. He died in 1713 and left an Inventory, but no Will. This Inventory was recorded among the Testamentary Proceedings of Annapolis, headed this way:-

He married, January 7, 1815, at St Louis, Missouri, Miss Sarah Wells, and by her, had Mary Nelson Sappington, born July 26, 1824; Benoni, born October 9, 1827; Joseph, born April 24, 1829; Washington, born

May 24, 1850 and

Thomas Jefferson Sappington, born at Sappington, Missouri, March 19, 1852, died at Sappington, August 14, 1897. He married, second wife, Julia Ann Leffingwell, on February 10, 1870 at Kirkwood, Missouri, and by her had, Jack Williams, born October 23, 1873; Clarence Leffingwell, born Sept. 2, 1875; Bird Tyrie, born March 15, 1879 and

I have found that the first sons remained in Cecil;
That James removed to Kent County. That John, William, and
Thomas finally settled in Anne Arundel County and left Wills
recorded at Annapolis in 1765, 1770, 1768.

Thomas Sappington's Will of 1768 names sons "Mark Brown", Thomas, and four younger children; Mary, Francis, Richard, and John. This last named son, born 1759, near Havre de Grace, was the Western Immigrant from which descends Mr. Francis Perry Sappington.

My evidences are as follows:-

Thomas Sappington did not settle in Anne Arundel until after 1759, showing that he was in the neighborhood of Havre de Grace at the time of his youngest son's birth in 1750.

The return of Dr. Mark Brown Sappington to Harford Co., shows that Thomas Sappington held property there which by his Will of 1768 was left to his two eldest sons, Mark Brown Sappington, heir of his Harford Place, and son Thomas, heir of his home place, "Sappington Sweep".

Dr. Mark Brown Sappington was named by his maternal grandfather, Mark Brown of the Cavalier Browns of Virginia, who bought the lands of Neal Clarke adjoining his son-in-law Thomas Sappington, and in his Will of 1767, left it to Dr. Mark Brown S. who lived about the time of the Revolution. Adjoining this tract of "Near's Delight" was "Warfield Range" now the handsome home of U.S. Senator P. Gorman. At a Spring upon "Warfield's Range", only a few feet from Senator Gorman's barn and near the old pioneer cottage of Dr. John Warfield, met the "Whig Club" in 1774, led by Dr. Charles Alexander Warfield. There, it was determined

to go down to Annapolis in a body and demand Anthony Stewart that he should burn his own vessel, or hang before his own door.

All of the leading men of property in the neighborhood of that celebrated "Spring" went with Major Warfield. Captain Thomas Sappington was then dead, but his friend, Col. Henry Ridgeley, and his son, Dr. Mark Brown Sappington, and his brothers all joined and marched to the door of the Stewarts and made the above demand, which resulted in the burning of the vessel.

There hangs in the State House at Annapolis, a painting of that event by the late artist, Mr. Mayer, who pictured Major Warfield standing by Stewart as he fired the vessel.

In a history of Harford County, the above event is referred to as follows:-

"The first of the Sappington Family to settle in Harford, was Mark Sappington, M.D., who wielded a large influence among the people of his day. He was one of the men who went on board the Ship "Peggy Stewart" at Annapolis, Maryland, and told the Captain Stewart what he might expect if he revealed the parties who caused him to burn the tea".

This is followed by a biographical sketch of the Sappington Family of Harford including the present head, Dr. John Sappington of Darlington, ex-member of the Legislature of Maryland. His handsome, smiling portrait is also given.

The Will of Thomas Rutland in 1751 reads as follows:-

" I give to my grandson Thomas Sappington, 100 Acres of "Rutland's Purchase and several negroes (named) when he arrives at age".

The above Thomas Sappington was then only seven years of age. He was the only Thomas Sappington at that time in Maryland and was named for his grandfather, Thomas Rutland, and in 1755, we find him upon "Rutland's Purchase" to which he added a part of "Warfield's Range" and "Venis in Park", bought from Absolute Warfield, which was resurveyed into "Sappington Sweep". This long sweep of land lay on the old Annapolis Road about two and one half miles north of Lannel, the beginning point of "Rutland's Purchase".

The Rutland Family in Anne Arundel became very wealthy. Thomas Rutland, Jr. carried a large impotting house in Annapolis, built a row of houses still known as Rutland's Row. The family connections here were the Stewarts, Waymans, Sappingtons, Snowdens, and Dorseys, all inheriting large landed estates from the Rutlands.

The Rutlands of England, are shown in the pedigree and effigy of Francis Rutland from his Brass Chisheden Church, to be seen in the pavement of the Chancel. He was the son and heir of Nicholas of Surry, who married a daughter of Thomas Stevens.

The Browns and Brownes of both Maryland and Virginia came from England, Ireland, and Scotland, all represented in Burke's General Armory by many different Coats of Arms.

The descendants of Valentine Brown, one of the auditors of Her Majesty's Exchequer and previously Commissioner to Ireland

and Scotland for Edward VIth, and Mary 1st, and his son Sir Thomas Brown, Knight, third son of Sir Valentine Brown, Knight, of Crofts, by his wife Thomascine, sister of Sir Nicholas Bacon, Lord Keeper of England in the time of Queen Elizabeth, are known to be settlers on the Severn and participants in the Battle of the Severn in 1655. These were of Harford and bore Arms the same as the Earl of Kenmare, as shown by their funeral entry.

The Brownes of Ireland confirmed in 1614 to Stephen Browne of County Down, brother of John Browne of County Derby, descendants of Le Brune, who stands on the Roll of Battle Abbey, had descendants here whose Crest is on record at Annapolis in Original Will of one descendant:-

"Ermine on a fess embattled counter embossed sable, three escapheps Argent".

CREST:

Out of a mural crown gules, a stork's head and neck ermine, beaked azure.

The Browns of Virginia and their Coats of Arms may be found in Hayden's "Virginia Families," and "Virginia Cousins".

CAPTAIN THOMAS SAPPINGTON

of

"SAPPINGTON SWEEP"

This title was given him by the Officials connected with the record of his Will. He gained that title in his service for the State during the French and Indian War as an Officer in Col. Henry Ridgeley's Volunteer Company to Governor Sharpe and aided him in repelling the Indians who were threatening our frontier.

Col. Ridgeley's Company of 50 men, many of whom were his immediate neighbors, had been recorded in Scharf's History of Maryland.

Governor Sharpe, after the successful resistance of the Maryland Volunteers, including Col. Ridgeley's Company, appointed a day of Thanksgiving. Col. Ridgeley himself, in his memorial to the Council of Safety (See Archives of Md. 1755) refers to his service and appointment as Colonel of Militia.

Col. Ridgeley and Capt. Sappington were immediate neighbors, friends, and associates, as shown by the marriage of Captain Sappington's daughter "Polly". I have seen her grave and headstone marked "Polly Sappington" at Sappington Sweep on Hammonds "Great Branch".

Captain Sappington's services carries his descendants to

the Colonial Wars. The services of his sons, Dr. Mark Brown Sappington and Thomas Sappington are both recorded in the Archives of 1775 - as Members of the "Committee of Observation" for Anne Arundel County.

Dr. F.B. Sappington, another son of Capt. Thomas, married a cousin of his brother's wife - Ann Ridgeley, sister of Judge Richmond Ridgeley. She was an aunt of Commodore Dan'l. Boone Ridgeley. Dr. Francis Brown Sappington removed to Liberty, Frederick County and left a son, Col. Thomas Sappington who was several times State Senator and once President of the Maryland Senate.

Col. Thomas Sappington left a family of distinguished Physicians. His sister, Harriet Sappington, was pronounced "the handsomest lady in Maryland". She became the wife of Dr. Peregrine Warfield, son of Major Charles Alexander of "The Peggy Stewarts".

The marriage record of John Sappington, proprietor of Mr. Francis Perry Sappington, by his wife Jemima Fowler, records their first son Zephaniah, in honor of her family and his second son, Thomas, in honor of his own father. The third son, Mark, in honor of his brother, Dr. Mark Brown Sappington.

One more son, Dr. Richard Sappington, Surgeon General of the Continental Forces, is frequently named in the Archives.

The descendants of Capt. Sappington can clearly claim both both Colonial Wars and Sons of the Revolution.

THE RUTLAND FAMILY

The Rutland Family in Maryland can go back to a distinguished family represented by the Earl of Rutland, Baron Manners of Haddon, Derby. (The most noble Sir John James Robert Manners, P.C., G.C. B.-D. C. L.- L. S. D.)

ARMS:-

On a chapeau gules, turned up ermine, a peacock in its pride ppr.

The Rutlands of Surrey bore "A Nag's Head".

Mr. Fred Rutland of Richmond, Surrey, bore "A Horse's Head, erased sable, MOTTO:-

Post Praelia Praemia.
(Reward after Battle)

The daughter of the first Thomas Rutland of 1731 then were Mrs. Sappington, Mrs. Elizabeth Stewart, and Mrs. Leonard Wayman (Ann Wayman). The daughters of the second Thomas Rutland of 1774, were Mrs. Mary Dorsey of "Hockley", Mrs. Elizabeth Spawden, wife Ann Rutland or Ann Norwood.

The tradition from the Dorseys of Hockley's is, that Thomas Rutland was of an importing house in Annapolis and that he built a row of houses in the City of Annapolis, long known as the Rutland Row. His Will bears out this tradition, for he willed a large estate in both the County and City. The tradition also adds that he was a descendant of the Earl of Rutland. The authority for the above tradition is Mrs. Anne Elizabeth Dorsey of

"Hockley", three miles west of Annapolis.

The Browns or Browne Family of Maryland and Virginia finally dropped the "E" from their names as the Wills show.

The Brownes of England were all Sires, coming from the distinguished Sir Stephen Le Brune, eldest son of Hugh Le Brune, one of the Lords of the Marches of Wales. He married Eve, sister of Griffith, Prince of Wales.

The descendants are represented in nearly every County of England, bearing, according to Burke and Fairbairne, many different Crests. One of these still extant in Maryland, is shown upon an original Will. It is a Stork upon its nest.

Will of Richard Brackett of Braintree, New England

I, Richard Brackett of Braintree in New England, being mindful of my mortallity and being of memory and of a disposing mind a trustin_g in God through Jesus Christ, my only savior for eternal life salvation, revoking and making null all former wills by me made, do make and ordain this my last will and testament as followeth.

My will is that all my just debts, if any be, be first paid and funeral charges be defrayed.

Item. I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife, Allice Brackett, all my estate in housing, orchards, lands and meadows in Braintry for her comfortable substance during her natural life, as also the income of my estate at Billerica.

Item. I give to the children of my son John Brackett one-fourth part of all my land and meadows and housing in Billerica, as it shall fall by equal division, to be equally divided to them and their heirs. My meaning is the children that he had by his wife Hannah Brackett.

Item. I give and bequeath the remaining three parts of my housing, lands, and meadows in Billerica to my son Pete Brackett, and son-in-law Simon Crosby, and son-in-law Joseph Thompson and to their heirs to be equally divided between them.

Item. I give to my son Peter Brackett five pounds in current pay, to be paid by my executors.

Item. My will is that the division of my lands in Billerica, as above disposed, shall be made by indifferent men, to the persons concerned in each fourth part to choose one man.

Item. My will is that the children of my son John, and Peter Brackett, Simon Crosby and Joseph Thompson, shall pay unto the two daughters of my son Joseph, deceased, Elizabeth & Sarah, 20 pounds apiece in good pay when they shall attain the age of 20 years respectively; and in want of the payment of said 40 pounds, they the said Elizabeth & Sarah, shall have $\frac{1}{2}$ of the land above mentioned, to them and to their heirs, to be equally divided to them. And in case either of said Elizabeth and Sarah shall die without issue, the legacies to her given shall be to the survivor. I give to said Sarah, the daughter of my son Josiah, 5 pounds in current pay, and the feather bed her mother carryed away.

Item, I give to my son James all of my new dwelling house, barn, orchard, land and meadows, lying and being in Braintry aforesaid, next and immediately after my wifes decease (excepting what may be necessarily expended for her maintenance during her life) to him and his heirs forever.

THE WILL OF THOMAS FOX OF CONCORD, MASS.

DIED APRIL 14, 1658

I, Thomas Fox of Concord, in the County of Middlesex, in Massachusetts Colony, being feeble and weak in body but of sound mind and memory, do make this my last will and testament in manner and form following: First, I commit and commend my soul unto the hands of the Lord, my God, submitting in the richness of his grace that he hath redeemed it by the precious blood of Jesus Christ; that my body be decently buried, believing that though soul and body be separated for a time, yet they shall be united again at the resurrection of the just to reign with Christ in eternal glory; and for the outward state which the Lord hath been gratified to give me, I for the present leave both house and lands, cattle and moveables, in the possession of my wife, Hannah, and my will is that she shall have and hold all until my eldest son, Eliphalet, shall arrive at the age of one and twenty years, and then in case my said son, Eliphalet, will then undertake the payment of five pounds to each of the rest of my children as they shall come to the said age of one and twenty years, that then he shall have and enjoy two-thirds of the land and meadow, my said wife enjoying the said dwelling and a third part of the barn and of the land during the term of her life except in the case, however, accepted, and after her decease then the other third part of the land, with the house and appurtenances to return to my son, Eliphalet.

But in case he shall refuse to pay the said portion to the rest of my children -- to my daughter Elizabeth, five pounds within one year after and to the rest at the day of one and twenty years, -- that then my said wife Hannah, shall pay or cause to be paid by her executors and assigns to my son, Eliphilet, the sum of ten pounds within six months after the refusal, and she shall have full power to dispose of the said house and lands to one or more of the rest of my sons as she shall think most meet; and he or they to whom they are disposed shall give to the rest of my children the said sum of five pounds apiece at the time and age aforesaid; also my will is that the said house and lands shall remain to one or more of said sons except those * * * of selling part of the land for the payment of said portions; and in case part be sold, my will is that no part of the house, lot from the said house, nor two acres of land at the lower end, in Bricklnfield, nor an acre and a half in Tomkin's meadow beyond C----field. But what other parts of the said land or meadow shall or they shall see cause to sell, they have the liberty and power so to do. Also my will is that in case my said son Eliphilet shall accept the said two-thirds of the land at the age of one and twenty years on the terms aforesaid, that my said wife Hannah, shall hold for her two-third part during her life, with the house and a third part of the barn, an acre of plough land usually called the hollow on top of the hill behind the house on the other side of the highway, and the said two acres in Bricklnfield and the two acres

of meadow before excepted and six acres of the new land adjoining to my house lot meadow. Also in case my said wife Hannah be married to another man and shall not live in the said house and land when the said son Eliphilet shall be one and twenty years old, that then in case he shall accept the land on the terms aforesaid, he shall also enjoy the house and the whole house lot and the other parts before excepted, so giving to my said wife yearly during her life, the third part of the yearly worth of the whole as it shall be judged to be worth by the year. Also in case my said wife Hannah dies before my said son Eliphilet come to the age aforesaid, that then the overseers of this will hereunder mentioned or their assigns for that purpose, shall have power to * * * and dispose of things for the benefit of my said children to trades and abroad as they shall see cause, only my said wife Hannah hath liberty to choose any one of them I had by her, to continue with her. Also I appoint and constitute my said wife Hannah, the executor of this my last will and testament for the payment of debts and overseeing the estate in lands and chattels until my said son Eliphilet be at the age of one and twenty years, and the two-thirds of the land to come to him if he accept thereof as aforesaid, but otherwise to dispose of things as is before expressed, and whether she live till that time or not, shall have when she dies, full power to dispose of the chattels and moveables as she shall think best. Also I appoint and constitute my loving uncle, Thomas Brooks, my loving bretheren, Moses Wheate and Thomas Bateman and my loving friend and neighbor, Robert Fletcher, the overseers of this my last will and testament.

Item: I give to my granddaughter Margaret Briscoe, daughter of Hezekiah and Susanna Briscoe, one negro girl named Henny and her increase.

Item: I give to my grandson John Willson, one negro woman named Moll and her increase.

Item: I give my wearing apparel to be all equally divided between my two daughters Martha Willson and Elizabeth Briscoe.

Item: I give to my son Hezekiah Briscoe, all that tract or parcel of land called the Retirement, being part in St. Mary's and part in Charles County to him and his heirs forever, and lastly I give all the rest of my estate whether personal or real, after my just debts are paid and my body buried after a decent and Christian manner, to my son Hezekiah Briscoe, whom I constitute & appoint to be whole and sole executor of this my last will and testament, and I hereby reject and make void all other wills here to fore by me made, and confirm this as my will only. In the name of God, Amen! I, Samuel Fox, of New London, in the colony of Connecticut, in New England, being in health and in perfect memory, but calling to mind the mortality of my body and that it is appointed for man once to die, and not knowing how soon my change may be and desiring that there may be peace left amongst those that I shall leave behind me, do now make this my last will and testament (hereby revoking all other wills made by me) in manner following:

First, I bequeath my soul to God that gave it to me, nothing doubting, but at the great and last day my soul and body will be united and stand before my Judge with perfect hope of happiness to all eternity through the merits of my Saviour and dear Redeemer, our Lord Jesus Christ.

Imprimis: My will is that my body be decently buried at the discretion of my executors hereafter named and appointed by me; and that my just debts and funeral charges be first paid out of my estate. I dispose of the remainder of my estate, both real and personal, as follows, viz.:

I give unto my wife, Esther Fox, all the estate that she brought with her to me when I married her; I mean all that shall be left at my decease, she making it to appear to be such to the

satisfaction of my executors, or either of them, and to have an honorable maintenance out of my estate during her widowhood in manner hereafter mentioned, my wife disclaiming any dower in my lands.

I give unto my son, Samuel Fox the elder, my wearing apparel of all sorts which, with what he hath already received of me formerly and an equal share I by this my will give to my said son, Samuel Fox the elder, with others of my children hereafter described, which I judge is sufficient in consideration of his being my eldest son.

I give and bequeath to my younger son, Samuel Fox, all my ploughs and plough tackling, carts and cart wheels, with all chains and husbandry tools of any sort whatsoever. And my will is that all my lands in New London, in a place called the General Neck, be it called by what name or name soever, be first offered to my said son, Samuel Fox the younger, at the price that they shall be appraised by men as the law directs after my decease, to be paid unto my executors by my son, Samuel Fox the younger, which money shall be disposed in among my children, as hereafter expressed. Always it is to be understood that I do not my *** where I now live, to be prized to my son, Samuel Fox the younger, but only that part of it which is not given to him by a deed of gift under my hand and seal. And in case my said son, Samuel Fox the younger, do not see cause to take said lands as appraised in manner aforesaid, that my will is

that I give said land above mentioned to be appraised to my other children --- namely, Samuel Fox the elder, Isaac Fox, Benjamin Fox, my daughters, Elisabeth and Anna --- to be equally divided amongst them, excepting to my son, Benjamin Fox, and he to have only half so much as any of the rest. Considering that the one-half with what he hath already given him by me, be his full shares or proportion, to them and their heirs and assigns forever, to be set out to my above said children, by men chosen by Timothy Green, of New London, printer. My will is that out of my estate, be given to the children of my daughter-in-law, Bathshua Rogers (deceased), the sum of ten pounds money to be equally divided among them. I give unto my son-in-law, John Smith, the sum of twenty shillings which, with what I have given him already, I think to be sufficient for him. I give unto the children of my daughter-in-law, Elisabeth Camp (deceased), the sum of ten pounds to be equally divided amongst them. I give unto my grand-daughter, Elisabeth Flotta, the sum of ten pounds money. My will is that if any of my children happen to fall in debt to me at my decease, it shall be allowed as so much of their portion, and if any of them are more in debt than their parts will come to, the overplus to be paid to my executors.

My will is that Timothy and my eldest son, Samuel Fox, be the executors of this my last will and testament, and that they be honorably relieved out of my estate for their care and trouble about the same. Also I do appoint Timothy Green one of my executors to

take care of my wife, Esther Fox, and see that she hath an honorable maintenance out of my estate during her widowhood, and I do give unto my executor, Timothy Green, full power to keep up so much of my estate in his hands as he may judge needful for her subsistence and his trouble about the same during her widowhood, and at her decease, all my estate to be equally divided among my children as above said.

And I do appoint my said executor, Timothy Green, to set out to my eldest son, Samuel Fox, his part of my estate here given to him, as equally as he can in his judgment think right, and I do appoint my executors to set out and make a division of my estate to the rest of my children. And I do declare this instrument (written on the other side of this paper) to be my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 6th day of April, in the thirteenth year of the reign of King George and in the year of our Lord, one thousand seven hundred and twenty-seven.

SIXTHLY: My will is that if any of my legatees shall throw any obstruction in the way of my executor in the execution of this will, he, she, or they, shall forfeit all right or legacies they might otherwise be entitled to under this will.
