EARLY SETTLERS
of
NODAWAY COUNTY, MISSOURI.

(The following excerpts were taken from the History of Nodaway County, Mo., published by the National Historical Co., St. Joseph, Mo., in 1882. The book is not indexed.)

Nodaway County takes its name from the river Nodaway, which is an Indian name, signifying placid. Many of the streams which flow through this portion of the state were named by the Indians.

In February, 1841, when the act creating Holt County was passed, it was given the name of Nodaway, but a subsequent act passed at the same session changed this to Holt, and the name "Nodaway" was reserved for the present county, whose organization was perfected four years later, in 1845.

Nodaway County was a part of the Platte Purchase and until the winter of 1845 when it was made a separate county, it was a part of Andrew County. Although the following accounts of early settlers make many references to years prior to 1845, any official records for those years should be found in the courthouse of Andrew County, of which the area comprising Nodaway County was still a part.

From the spring of 1839 to the fall of 1840, there were perhaps, not to exceed six permanent settlers in this territory. During this time, a number of white men had penetrated the country, some on hunting expeditions and others with the view of locating, but its remoteness from the then centers of trade, and the country still being inhabited by roving bands of Indians, but few remained with their families. Isaac Hogan, Hiram Hall, Joseph Hutson, Thomas Heady, L. N. Prather, Hay White and possibly one other person, were the first settlers in the area which became Nodaway County. Their settlements were made in Hughes, Lincoln and White Cloud Townships.

Atchison Township. Ephraim W. Johnson was the first settler of this township, arriving from Lawrence Co., Indiana, Nov. 6, 1841. In 1842, he settled three-fourths of a mile south of the Iowa State Line. This territory was then part of Andrew County. He had two brothers, Thomas and Eli B. Johnson, who came at the same time, but they emigrated to California in 1841. Ephraim W. Johnson and his wife reared nine children, all of whom married. Their son, Eli B. Johnson, was the first child born in Atchison Township. In 1882, Mr. & Mrs. Johnson had 50 grandchildren and 11 great-grandchildren.

Next settlers were probably Mr. Barner and John and William Taner, and their widowed mother, who came from Virginia in 1842. After these pioneers, was probably a widow by the name of Hickman, with her two sons, John and Henry, who came from

Dark County, Indiana, in 1843. Mr. Cartright came from Indiana in 1843; Elijah Walters from Indiana in 1844; John H. Warrens from Johnson Co., Missouri, in 1845. In 1866, the latter moved to Gage County, Nebraska. Elijah Walters and James Roberts came early and settled where the old town of Clearmont stands. West Farrens and Harvey Dillon came early. Harvey Dillon died in 1850. William Houston, in 1844 from Indiana, stopped the first three years at Savannah (Andrew Co.). Alexander Swaney came early, and J. C. Smith and John Allison came in 1855.

Isaac Broderick came early from Tennessee; Judge Elijah Shelton came from Indiana. Dr. William Blagg grew up in Nodaway County. In 1848, A. J. Dearing came from Virginia, stopping first in Cooper and Andrew Counties, and to Nodaway in 1856. James F. Hainey came from Kentucky to Washington Township in 1851 and died there in May, 1862. P. J. Hainey, his son, came to Grant Township, and afterwards moved to Barnard. Valentine Korell came from Prussia, June 19, 1850. He first went to St. Louis, and then to Barnard, Grant Township, in 1852.

Green Township.

William Bowman came in 1841; he sold out to James Roberts in about 1843 and went to Oregon. Joseph Hutson settled on Mill Creek in 1840. Elijah Dodson came in 1842. About ten years later, he sold out and went to Oregon. He had two sons, William and Jesse, and three sons-in-law named John Dawson and Dennis Dawson (brothers) and John Harris. All came in 1842.

John Porter came in 1843; he sold out and went to Oregon. Joseph Hutson, oldest pioneer in Nodaway west of the Nodaway River, says he has seen as many as sixty wagons a day going to the Pacific Coast.

Hiram Lee was among the earliest settlers of this township. He sold out to Joel Albright in 1853. In 1849, William R. Holt bought a piece of land from Richard Miller. William V. Smith was in Green Township by 1849.

Hopkins Township.

William Broyles was the first settler in the territory that is now Hopkins Township, coming in 1843. John Kimball came two years later. Washington Downing was the next settler; David J. Wiet, next; James Hinckle, next. Berry Miller and John Dunkin settled on the same place which now belongs to Jesse Crandle (1882). William Cook, John Elliott, David Lock, B. F. Rader, Charles Carson, Henry Stine, Edwin Spencer, Max Murphy, Isaiah Wilcox were other early settlers. Jefferson Sturgeon came about 1850. Judge Morehouse came early; also, Joseph Hall, and Homer Aldridge and Augustus Aldridge.

Hughes Township.

The first settler in this township was Isaac Hogan. Some time in the fall of 1840, Elijah Bunten, James Bryant and Harvey White explored the White Cloud country and took claims. "In those days all that was necessary to be owner of a tract of land as large as one desired, was to lay claim to it; the manner of procuring a title in "fee simple" was to cut down four trees and chop them off and lay the foundation for a house. Whether the cabin was ever completed or not, it constituted a claim that all honorable men respected." Elijah Bunten was a professional claim-taker. In 1840 he sold a claim to Mijamin Byers. He later moved to Oregon where he died in 1869.

Harvey White, a son-in-law of Bunten, sold his land to a man named Guy and moved to Oregon. Jim Bryant who was one-fourth Indian, had a claim. These three families on White Cloud Creek, and Dave Vinsonhaler and Harvey Dillon were the only white people who spent winters of 1839 and 1840 in Nodaway County. In 1840, Isaac Hogan moved his family from Platte County. They were accompanied by Daniel Hogan, Joseph Thompson and Richard Taylor and wife. Daniel Hogan was at the time a single man and made his home with Isaac Hogan. Joseph Thompson was, also, a single man and made his home with Isaac Hogan. William M. Stewart decided to remain in Platte County and gave his claim to Joseph Thompson. Other early ones in this township were: Wesley Jenkins, Orville Graves, William Looker and

James M. Kyle, who moved his family to the claim in 1840. Kyle had a large number of sons and daughters, who are now deceased or living out West.

James Finch sold out to Joseph Cox and moved to Platte County where he died in 1853. Thomas Finch traded his land in 1841 or 1842 for some slaves from Col. I. N. Prather, the father of James B. Prather of Maryville. In the spring of 1842 he moved to Platte Co., where he died. Nathaniel Finch sold his claim and returned to Platte County, where he died and was buried by the side of his brothers. Joseph Hugg, William Stevens, and a man by name of Henshaw had early claims. Ben Owens sold his claim to a man named Thomas Baker from Platte County and moved to Texas. Thomas Baker bought several claims, but near the close of the war with Mexico, he sold his land to Ennis Burris and moved to Texas. James Waumic returned to Platte County and then went to Gentry County.

During the winter of 1840 or 1841, William Marlow, a man named Robison and Abraham Cline secured claims. Marlow was a professional claim taker. In 1841 came Daniel Marlin, father of T. L., who had resided in Platte County. Mr. Marlin went west in 1850 and died on the way to California. His wife remained on the farm with the son, a small boy. She was a cousin of Rev. Jesse Allen of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church.

Cornelius Brackney, after a few years, moved to near Council Bluffs, Iowa. Mathew Ferrell settled on the land now owned (1882) by Lewis Morgan. Elijah Hubble and his wife came early.

In 1847 Samuel Russell sold his claim to Elisha Brown and went to Oregon where he died soon after arrival. He left his wife and two children in Oregon.

Elisha Brown sold the claim in 1849 to A. J. Anderson and went to Oregon. His wife died on the way. Mr. Brown was killed by a grizzly bear in Oregon.

Raphael Dixon came from Tennessee, but first to Andrew Co. In 1863 he went to Nebraska. His son, William Dixon, living in Nodaway Co.

Isaac Guill came from Kentucky in 1847. In 1863, he went to Nebraska. John Hall came from Iowa in 1847. He sold to Isaac A. Lanning in 1852 and went to Oregon where he died about 1878.

Andrew Jackson Anderson was born April 3, 1823, in Pulaski Co., Kentucky, son of James Anderson who was born in Montgomery Co., Va., and Elizabeth Clifton. James Anderson died in Kentucky and his wife, Elizabeth Anderson, came to Nodaway to reside with her son. She died April 13, 1881, age 70. Andrew Jackson Anderson had moved from Kentucky to Hendricks Co., Indiana, in 1829. Then he came to Andrew Co., and later to Nodaway. He married on 2nd Feb. 1828, Candace Grindstaff, daughter of Jacob and Rebecca Grindstaff. In 1849, he bought a claim from Elisha Brown. (Samuel Russell and Elisha Brown moved to Oregon, where the former shortly died.) Mr. Anderson has seven children living: James, Elizabeth, Andrew J., Delicia, Martin, Charles Perry and John. James Anderson married Rosanna, daughter of George Hawk; Elizabeth married Fielding Thompson. The other children are unmarried.

Isaac Davis came from Kentucky. He died about two years ago. Allen Stephenson came from Kentucky. He stopped for a time in Buchanan County. Christopher C. Horn came from Indiana; he is still living. John York came from North Carolina in 1855; Alexander Wilson from Indiana in 1856. He had son, William Wilson. John Wilson, brother of Alexander came from Indiana in 1856. He died several years ago. John Stobaugh, a brother-in-law of John Wilson, was from Indiana. He is still living. (1882). Michael Shuck came from Iowa; he was originally from Tennessee. He now lives in Worth Co., Mo. William Stingley, brother of Moses Stingley, came originally from Virginia. He reared a large family. He died several years ago and the family moved away. Thomas Lucas, who came from North Carolina, is still living. H. N. Pool came from Iowa in 1856; he died six years ago.

Harrison Davis came from Kentucky in 1856. About five years ago, he moved to Kansas. Josiah Shuck moved from Kentucky to Iowa for a few years and in 1856, came to Nodaway, his farm adjoining that of his uncle Michael Shuck. He died several years ago. John Ham, originally from New Hampshire, went to Iowa for a few years and then to Nodaway in 1856. In 1863, the Legislature cut off a slice from Nodaway County for Worth County, so his farm was just over the line in Worth County.

John Hill came from Ohio in 1856. He moved to Kansas two years ago.

Jackson Township

Among the earliest settlers of this township was David Spoomer in 1844. Soon afterward, William Campbell came. One of the earliest settlers was Moses Stingley. He was born in Hardy County, Virginia, 4 September 1810. He left Virginia, September 1, 1832, and moved to Tippecanoe County, Ind.; he came to Missouri in 1844 and located in Andrew Co., where he rented a farm. He moved to Nodaway County in 1846. In this vast area

were but seven settlers when Mr. Stingley moved in. They were: David Spoonemore, Jesse Harper, Elisha Brown, Caliborne Hughes, Jacob Grindstaff, Jack Clifton, and John Clifton. Mr. Stingley married three times. His first wife died in Andrew County in the fall of 1845, leaving five children. On November 3, 1846, he married Eliza Moon of Nodaway. She died 15th day of June 1856, leaving five children, also. He married his present wife, Margaret L. Gray, 18 November 1856. There were six children by this marriage, three of whom are deceased. George R., William A., Hiram M., and Manford Stingley are married; Seymour, Norton, Craig, and Noah are single. Nancy married Adelma Stingley; Thursy Ann married Robert Ross; Rosina married Alex. Toys; Pernesia Jane married Wily Mow; Lozilla married George Gill. Oleny is single. He has four great-grandchildren, - three at Samuel Yarnall's and one at Fred Orr's. (This book contains a long article about Moses Stingley, but the above includes the genealogical portion.)

Isaac Lanning came from Ohio soon after Mr. Stingley came. George Conner came from Illinois in 1853. Then came Richard Ashworth, an Englishman by birth. He died several years ago, but the family is still here. Mrs. Minerva Smith came from Bartholomew County, Indiana. Benton Smith, a son, was only five when he came with his mother. Elon Smith was born in Nodaway County. Adelma Stingley, son-in-law of Moses Stingley, came from Indiana in 1856. Moses Spear was from New York. Mrs. Dorcas T. Yarnell came from Illinois. In 1857, Samuel Beeks came from Iowa, and the same year, Judge M. D. Nobles, from Illinois; about the same time, Reading Bowling from Illinois.

Jefferson Township

Among the first settlers was David Rhoades in 1846. He died in 1876. Samuel Ross came about the same year. Silas Best came with four sons. He died in 1875. Jacob Pugh was from Iowa. Anderson Smith came in 1857 from Virginia, and the same year Isaac Weatherman, from Tennessee. In 1858, John S. Aldridge came from Indiana, and Benjamin Casteel from the south. The latter died about a year ago in Montana. Sidney Smith came about 1856 from Cooper County, Mo. In 1858, Matthew Riley, from New York. Patrick Growney, originally from Ireland, lived in Brooklyn, New York, about twelve years and then came here in 1858. He died June 17, 1879. He had three sons; Phillip Growney and John Growney still live on their farms. Lawrence J. Growney is now Circuit Clerk and lives in Maryville.

Lincoln Township

Joseph Hutson was the first settler in Lincoln Township. He came from Clay County, Kentucky. John Oster, son of George Oster, an early settler, married Miss Melvina Potter of Caldwell Co. in 1843. Abijah Hampton married Nancy Oster, George Oster's daughter, and took a claim. William Taylor married another daughter, Julia Oster.

Alfred Graves and his brother, Aaron Graves, located on Tarkio Ridge. Mrs. Haney Lamar was the first person who died on the west side of the Nodaway River. She died Aug. 23, 1842. The second person was Rufus Lamar, her oldest son. John M. Lamar, Sr., was born in Anderson Co., Tenn., 6 July 1804, and died 16 August 1877. In 1841 he moved from Hendricks County, Ind., to Platte Co., Mo., and in May, 1842, to Nodaway Co. He married twice. Four children are living: Napoleon B., Charles J., Sarah and Rutela. Sarah married Thomas Lamar and Rutela married John Hudson. Napoleon B. Lamar was born in Anderson Co., Tenn., 13 Mar. 1829. Charles Lamar is two years younger. He married Kisiah Hudson.

"The Ohio Settlement". In 1856, Mr. J. H. Ware, Sr., came from Chillicothe, Ohio, and took a claim near Burlington Junction. He was formerly prosecuting Attorney of Ross Co., Ohio. Col. John Davis came soon afterwards and bought the claim of Levi Martin. He afterwards sold his farm and moved to Kansas. Thomas Corkin took a claim in 1862. Shadrick Cole and his son-in-law, William H. Franklin, took claims two miles south of Burlington Junction. Austin Jones and William B. Sunderland settled near each other. Thomas Fields, Mr. Sunderland's son-in-law, settled on Jones' land and lives there still. William Jones, father of Austin Jones, spent his time between Nodaway and Atchison Counties. He died about sixteen years ago. James Mitchel was near Austin Jones. Dr. Myers came about the same time. Soon afterwards, George Wilson took a claim. Jesse Walker, also, was near Burlington Junction. There were some forty families in the Ohio settlement who came from the middle southern portion of Ohio.

Polk Township

Thomas Adams was the first settler in 1840. In 1849, he went to Texas. Noah Garren came in 1840. In 1849 he moved to the northeastern part of Nodaway Co. In 1840, John Mozingo, with two sons, Allen and Silas, came from Culpepper Co., Tenn. (the writer must have meant Virginia). Allen Mozingo died in 1878. John Trosper came from Tennessee in 1840. He went to Kansas in 1860 and is now deceased. The Lanham brothers came

in 1841. They both went to Texas. William Saunders, brother of James Saunders, came in 1846. He was robbed and murdered in Maryville in 1879. In 1843, John Jackson came from Ohio. A. Terhune came from Indiana in 1841. Near him were Elisha, John, Isaiah and William Bennett, also Mr. Hayes, who came with them, and Joshua Wilson. On the west side of the lane were Jacob Bohart, John Barrens, David Terhune, David Brock, Lyman Ashley and A. Terhune. The settlers had to go to Liberty, Clay County, to secure anything of importance in the line of merchandise or flour.

Jesse Jones came from Pennsylvania. Thomas Blakely came from Cooper Co., Mo. James Irwin and Silas Best were early settlers. John S. Aldridge came from Indiana; Guilford Richards, from Va.

John Groves was born in Ohio, Feb. 19, 1801. He married Miss Susanna Vanpelt. They were the parents of 15 children; some are now in Missouri, some in Kansas, and one in Iowa. In 1838, Mr. Groves had moved to Indiana, in 1840 to Andrew Co., Mo., and in 1842 to what is now Nodaway. In 1842 there were only about a dozen men in Washington Twp. Jesse Stingley came from Indiana. Christopher Weatherman came from North Carolina in 1847. Wiley J. Brittain came in 1848 from North Carolina. Allen Gentry came about the same time. John Pulley, son-in-law of Thomas Blakely, came from Cooper Co., Mo. James T. Estes, another son-in-law of Mr. Blakely, also came from Cooper Co. In the spring of 1850, Anthony Groves came from Tennessee, and the same year, B. S. Cook from North Carolina. I. Wilson came from Buchanan Co. in 1851.

James Bryant, a half-breed, took up a claim. Mrs. Martha Vandervert came from Kentucky in 1843. In 1846, James Saunders came from Virginia. Aaron and Isaac Groves were from Tennessee. About the same time, William A. Ammons came from Virginia. Mijamin Byers was from Ill. Soon, Simon Holland came from Tennessee and William Edster from Kentucky and Nicholas Kavanaugh from Kentucky..

Explanatory Notes

The following 1850 Census was copied from a microfilm copy of the original census book in the National Archives at Washington, D. C. The 1850 Federal Census was the first one which listed every member of the household by name, the earlier census records having listed only the head of the family by name and the other members by age groups.

Although many libraries and historical societies own microfilm copies of the 1850 census, many persons do not have access to those records; furthermore, since the records are in the original handwriting, often poor and in very faded ink, many find it difficult to read the microfilm. It has, also, been found that if one will read through the entire census for a county, he will often find records of family connections he had not realized were there. Families or old friends often moved in groups, or followed others to a new territory, so it is helpful to note the neighbors.

Although in the following census we have included every name given in the original census, the original record lists the names in columns, whereas we have given them in lines in order to reduce the number of pages to the book, and consequently, the price charged for the book.

The families are listed in the same order as given in the original. The number before the head of the household is the household number. For the head of the household, in addition to the age and birthplace, the occupation is given, and the dollar figure, if given, represents the assessed value of real estate. For some, no value is given. They may have been renters or may not have purchased their land by that time. If the surname or State of birth is not given, it is the same as the last preceding one. When the birthplace changes, the new State is shown. The letter (m) or (f) for male or female is shown only when the name might not indicate it.

Sometimes names were spelled several different ways, often in the way they sounded to the census taker. The reader would be wise to consider all possible spellings. For instance, a "k" was often substituted for "c" or an "f" for "ph" and vice versa. An "s" was sometimes dropped from the end of a name where it is always used today. The compilers have copied the names the way they appear in the original record.

They were listed by age group, and whether male or female, under the name of the owner. The few families listed under the regular 1850 census as being black or mulatto were not slaves.)

Below we list only the name of the owner and the number of slaves.
