APPLICATION FOR UNITED STATES CITIZEN'S IDENTITY CARD.

(Issue Identity Card Form I for Mexican border crossings and Form J for travel to insular possessions.)

This application is to be used by both naturalized citizens and persons claiming citizenship through the naturalization of husband or parent, when applying for passage between continental and insular ports of the United States, Bermuda, and Canada; and by the two classes above named living within and for travel within the 10-mile zone on either side of the Mexican border.

Must be in duplicate and accompanied by three unmounted photographs of the applicant, not larger than three by three inches in size, one of which is to be affixed to the identity card by the Permit Agent; the other two must be attached to this application and its duplicate, respectively. The photographs must be on thin paper and should have a light background. The one not attached to the applications should be signed by the applicant across the front thereof, so as not to obscure the features.

An applicant registered or enrolled or subject to registry or enrollment for military service in the United States must submit with his application a permit from his local draft board.
