

Fred Carver, a member of the Yakima Valley Genealogical Society, was guest speaker at a meeting of the Tri-City Genealogical Society on Friday, April 3, at the Pasco Public Library. Fred and his wife, Margaret, had been speakers at a workshop sponsored in Eugene, Oregon, the previous weekend by the Oregon Genealogical Society.

"Slicing up the Apple State" was his topic, and he showed a number of maps to illustrate the organization of Washington counties from the earliest days of Oregon Territory to the present. Washington State has no publication on county organization, so he went to a law library and copied every law that applies to this subject. Some of the research on Oregon Territory was done in Salem. Mr. Carver found that the earliest Oregon Territory laws were based on those found in a book of Iowa laws brought west by one of the earliest settlers. Subsequent development was influenced by administrators coming from the states of Illinois, Indiana, and Vermont. When Oregon became a state, Washington Territory was separated from it, and the organization of this area continued to follow the pattern set in Oregon.

Oregon Territory originally claimed all land from the forty-second parallel to the southern boundary of Russia's claims -- still remembered as the Fifty-four Forty or Fight dispute -- but the Treaty of Ghent settled the line on the present United States-Canadian boundary. Surveying on any extension of eastern lines was impossible, so an arbitrary base line was established as the Willamette Meridian, and all surveys are still in reference to it, as EWM (east of Willamette Meridian) or WWM. Each township surveyed covered six square miles and included thirty-six sections. Mr. Carver explained how some section lines "jog" to compensate for the curvature of the earth, and that this explains sudden sharp turns in county roads, which follow these surveyed lines.

Among the interesting items in Mr. Carver's talk was the explanation that Spokane County, while it was established quite early, was then un-organized and its area included in surrounding counties for many years until it was re-established in comparatively recent times.

#### SOCIETY'S LIBRARY MOVED

The collection of genealogical books and exchange periodicals owned by the Tri-City Genealogical Society, which has been housed for several years by the Mid-Columbia Regional Library in Kennewick, is being moved to the genealogical branch library in the Latter Day Saints Church at Sunset and Thayer Drive in Richland. The Society appreciates the cooperation of the Mid-Columbia Library in serving as custodian for this collection. However, it is felt that with the establishment of a purely genealogical library in the area, the Society's books will be more usable there.

Periodicals are being sorted and put into binders, after which Mrs. James Ballowe will include them in the numbering system which she is setting up for the L.D.S. Library.

Some of the periodicals, especially the exchange bulletins, are missing. While many are of such early dates that it is not likely that they could be found now, a few are quite recent, and members are asked to search their own libraries and take any exchanges they find to the May meeting so that they can be bound with the others.

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
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
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
