# NEWS OF THE SOCIETY

Election of officers for 1970-71 and approval of revision of the TCGS Constitution and By-Laws took place at the May meeting of the society. Current reorganizations among Hanford and Atomic Energy contractors made it impossible for anyone to accept the office of president at the moment. The board of directors will manage the affairs of the society until conditions settle. Those elected are:

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Pat Ballowe accepted the position of librarian.

Herbert N. Pedersen, chief librarian of the Tri-Cities Branch library of the Genealogical Society of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints, was guest speaker. He explained the belief of his church that the family is an eternal and basic unit, continuing after this life, and described the extensive record-keeping system his church requires. Among the records are more than 38 million 3 x 5 cards in the Temple Index Bureau (TIB), now open for search, even to non-members, through the use of forms available in branch libraries. More than two thousand forms are used every three months in the branch in Richland alone.

The Mormon society considers its first task the gathering of genealogical records of the whole world and making them available. More than 800,000 rolls of microfilm have been collected as part of this project. Eighty microfilm teams are at work throughout the world. The owner of the record receives one copy, another goes into a vault for permanent storage, and the third is used for making duplicates which can be rented through the branch libraries, 87 of which are already in operation,

Mr. Pedersen outlined plans for the future, which range from the desire to have enough microfilm readers so that no one will be kept waiting, to a projected library building on the church property at Sunset and Thayer, Richland. He hopes that the branch can eventually acquire all available U. S. Census film on "indefinite loan," and wants to inaugurate better map service. The church has started a campaign among its members for the donation of unused genealogical books and other materials.

He listed some of the little-known indexes available through the branch library, including ship passenger lists, a Norwegian census, a Canadian census, and Boyd's Marriage Index of England. The last includes about eight million names and is on 172 rolls of microfilm. The branch library is open from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday, from 7 p.m. to 10 p.m. Tuesday through Friday, and on Saturday by request.

BOOK REVIEW --- The 1968 edition of the GENEALOGICAL PERIODICAL ANNUAL INDEX (volume 7), edited by George Ely Russell in Bowie, Maryland, has arrived and will be shelved in the IDS Branch Library. This year 133 different periodicals are indexed, including the TOGS BULLETIN. The index is simple to use. One of its chief attractions is the careful listing of information by geographical area, so that it is possible to look under, for instance, Jefferson County, Pennsylvania, and discover what was published about that county during 1968. It is unfortunate, but understandable, that there is a two-year delay in receiving these indexes. Among the references to the TCGS BULLETIN are those for the History of the Larsen Family, and cemetery records for the vicinity of Woodland, Cowlitz County, Washing-- F.H.E. ton.
