

WAIT'S MILL, THE STORY OF THE COMMUNITY OF WAITSBURG, WASHINGTON, Chicago,

Adams Press, 214 pp., not indexed. /Purchased by T.C.G.S./

It is a history of the Touchet and Coppei Valleys from the passing of
Lewis and Clark to the early 1900's. Besides an account of the various encounters with the Indians, it gives colorful descriptions of changing patterns of life as the community grows and as new methods of farming, milling, and transportation develop. The last half of the book is an autobiography of Mr. Laidlaw's earlier years. He was born around the turn of the
century, and anyone with family roots in the area should find many familiar
names. The book does lack a table of contents, chapter headings, and an
index, limiting its value as a quick reference. — Katharine Woolcutt.

AMERICAN & BRITISH GENEALOGY & HERALDRY, by P. William Filby, Chicago, American Library Association, 1970. /Purchased by T.C.G.S./

Mr. Filby, a librarian and assistant director of the Maryland Historical Society, came to the United States from England in 1957 and found himself in a library which had a large genealogical collection. He began learning the "language" and segregating and sorting the books in order to be helpful to the clients. He says, "Genealogical research was on the increase, and it occurred to me that there must be many librarians throughout the country besieged by genealogists with but few versed in genealogy and with meager collections in the field. So was the idea of this work conceived -- to give the librarian a list of books necessary to enable his library to operate efficiently in the face of this new onslaught." This is indeed a welcome addition to the TCGS library. It was purchased with contributions from members as a memorial to the mothers of Jack and Frances Ehrig, TCGS members. Mrs. Axel T. Hansen (Mary Sarman) died in Omaha, Nebraska, 30 Nov. 1970, and Mrs. Charles Ehrig (Mabel Elwood) died in Walla Walla, Washington, 6 Jan. 1971. The bibliographical entries in the book are arranged geographically, first by state, then Canada, England, Ireland, Scotland, Wales, the British Island Areas, and Heraldry. It is carefully indexed, has many cross references, and is helpfully annotated. For instance, a famous source book for Virginia is noted, "Remarkable collection of information about the early settlement of the valley of Virginia. Errors; use with care." -- Frances Ehrig.

USEFUL ATLAS -- Carol Swanger (Mrs. James R.), 2637 W. 6th Avenue, Kennewick, has a 1902 United States Atlas which has helped many people find towns which are no longer in existence. Its index includes hamlets and crossroads where only a handful of people lived. Members may call 586-9284 to arrange a time when they can use the atlas in Mrs. Swanger's home.

MEMORIAL GIFT -- The TCGS executive board has voted to send a gift of \$5.00 to the Eastern Washington Genealogical Society as a memorial to the

late Lee D. Patchen, a member of that society. The gift will be a contribution toward the purchase of the four-volume genealogical index of the Newberry Library, Chicago, which costs \$300. Many members of the Tri-City society use the facilities of the Spokane Public Library, where the index is being placed.

NEIGHBORLY NEWS -- The Genealogical Forum of Portland. Ore,, is holding an open house in celebration of its 25th anniversary on May 10, 11 and 12 in the tenth floor auditorium of the downtown Meier & Frank store. The theme is "Genealogy Through the Ages," and there will be many special displays, speakers, and films.

SEATTLE SYMPOSIUM

Excitement far beyond the plans of the organizing committee opened the Seattle Genealogical Society Symposium March 26 when gale winds forced the closure of the Seattle Public Library 20 minutes after the beginning of the first session. Huge pieces of aluminum trim from the skyscraper bank building across the street were blowing straight at the library windows, and police advised evacuating the building. While a few of the 300 genealogists attending gave up and went home, most of those present took the excitement in good part and went along to quickly-found meeting rooms in the Olympic Hotel and a nearby Congregational Church. Communications were difficult, but problems were met with good humor. The hardest part was for speakers to get along without their visual aids, which were safely locked away in the library. The 73-mile-an-hour winds died down so that the li-

brary reopened Saturday, omitted programs were fitted into the day's schedule, and enthusiasm continued to increase.

Familiar names and faces kept appearing, among them Fred and Margaret Carver of the Yakima Valley Genealogical Society, who were guest speakers for TCGS last year; Edwin F. Casebeer Sr., Eastern Washington Genealogical Society, who spoke on Pennsylvania Research the year before; Mrs. Carol Lind of the Seattle Library staff; and Arthur D. Fiske, past-president of the Seattle Society.

Attending from the Tri-City Society were Jack and Frances Ehrig and Ruth Mitchell. Ruth had a mysterious experience -- the satchel containing her research records disappeared from her car in North Bend and reappeared later the same day at her hotel's desk. Frances presented her paper on Identifying and Dating Photographs by Technique and Fashion in a large meeting room at the Olympic Hotel, not too much hampered by the lack of her display boards, since a thoughtful Seattleite rushed forward with some personal photographs which helped greatly.

Saturday's session on preparing material for publication had to be shortened, but it was well attended. Roy Colbert, editor of the Seattle Society's BULIETIN, and Jack Ehrig, printer of the TCGS BULIETIN, talked on their aspects of the field. Frances Ehrig spoke on preparing "masters" for printing, and Mrs. Ross N. Kingston, Seattle, told how she binds her own books. Roy Colbert, in his introduction, announced that this was the "peanut butter" group, which would discuss printing at budget prices, and one listener commented later that if she had attended only this one session, she would have felt that she had received her ten dollars' worth.

SHALL WE HAVE A WASHINGTON HERITAGE COUNCIL?

This report is taken verbatim, with apologies, from the April issue of the Yakima Valley Genealogical Society BULLETIN, mostly because of the lengthy motion made by Fred Carver of that society -- no other copy of the motion is available.

From the standpoint of many, perhaps the most important event at the Seattle Symposium was the meeting Saturday morning attended by representatives of the Daughters of the Pioneers, the Washington State Pioneer Society and the Mayflower Society. The purpose of the panel was to assess whether an organization similar to the Oregon Heritage Council was needed to inventory material of genealogical and historical value in public and private hands, make the location of the materials found available to genealogists and historians and to act as a clearinghouse about projects underway or planned by members of the council, so that those planning new projects won't duplicate ones already satisfactorily completed or planned.

As chairman, Miss Helen Waterman, president of the Seattle Genealogical Society, asked the representative of each society present to state briefly the records they have collected that are of benefit to others and to comment on their respective societies' activities. By the time each representative had reported it was obvious that some records, such as cem-

etery records, have been duplicated in the past and also that some societies have records that are not known to other societies but would be of value to them. In other words, a means of making available to those doing genealogical and historical research the scope and location of existing records is needed.

Since the representatives of the various societies attending the panel had no authority from their respective societies to take any action at this meeting, no official action was taken. However, those attending passed a motion expressing the consensus of those present which may be summarized as follows:

- 1. That we need an organization similar to the Oregon Heritage Council.
- 2. That the president of the Seattle Genealogical Society, Miss Helen Waterman, be temporary chairman of a committee to arrange a meeting at a suitable future date to consider formation of such a council and that before said meeting she secure a copy of the Constitution and By-Laws of the Oregon Heritage Council and circulate it to those who plan to attend the meeting.
- 3. That each representative of a society present report to his society that they are requested to approve attendance at the meeting to be called by Miss Waterman of a delegate and not more than two alternate delegates to act for their society.
- 4. That the proposed meeting of delegates from the various genealogical and historical societies plan to draw up a Constitution and By-Laws and statement of activities for such a council, which shall include provision for a quarterly news-letter to each member society that will report the council's activities and immediately begin acting as a clearinghouse for information about current and projected projects of the member societies.
- 5. That the proposed Constitution, By-Laws and statement of activities, etc., prepared at this meeting be submitted to each potential member society for discussion, amendment if necessary, and ratification.

Although not stated in the motion, the thought was also in the minds of those present at the meeting on March 27 that the call for the meeting proposed above should include an invitation to all other genealogical and historical societies in the state, who wish, to take part.
