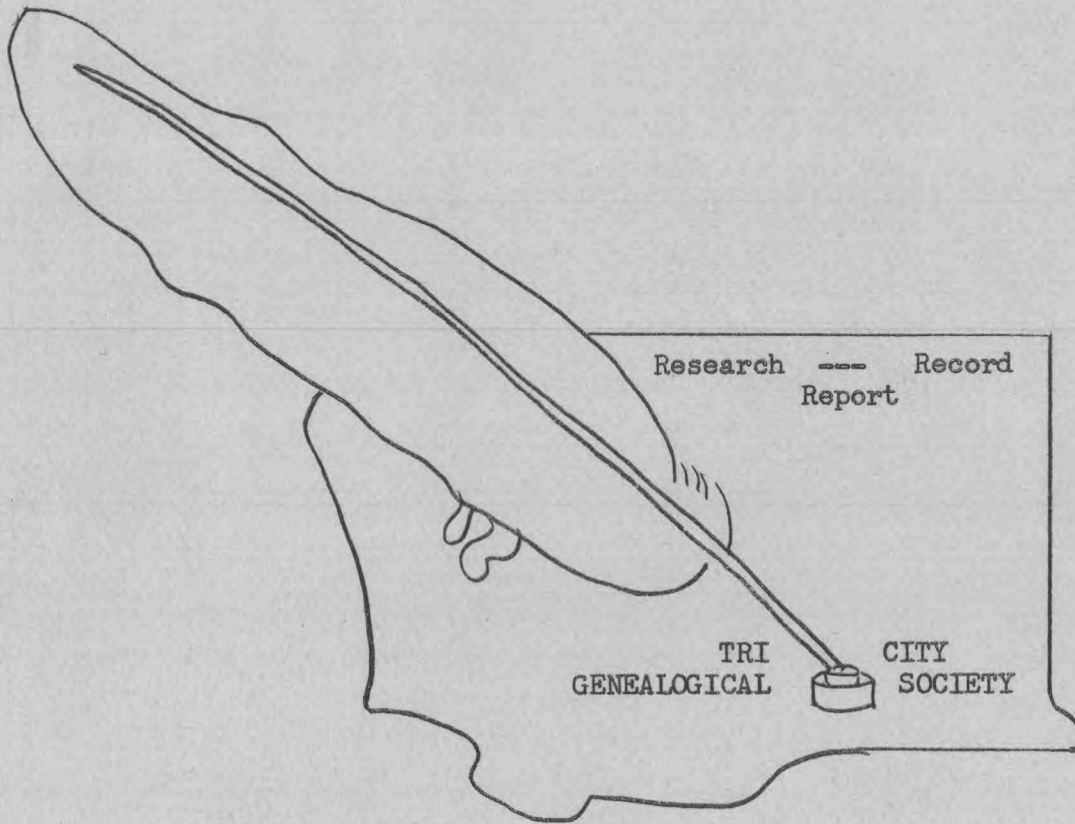

(Information useful in tracing family history turns up in some unlikely places. Evelyn Massie, TCGS president, found such material in a booklet brought home by her son, Robert G. Massie, a new member of the U. S. Armed Services. It is titled History, Customs and Traditions, 1846-1970, Third Armored Cavalry, "The Regiment of Mounted Riflemen." Those who find familiar-sounding names can, of course, request veterans' records through the National Archives. Excerpts from the booklet follow.)

The history of the 3d Armored Cavalry is an illustrious record of faithful and unbroken service to our nation. Organized in 1846 as The Regiment of Mounted Riflemen, the regiment has participated in thirty-six campaigns in seven wars. It has served with distinction at home and abroad in both war and peace.

The roster of officers includes some of our country's most distinguished soldiers: Lt. General J. E. B. Stuart, CSA; Lt. General Joseph L. Wheeler, CSA; Major General Guy V. Henry, 12th Colonel; his son, also Major General Guy V. Henry, 24th Colonel, and later the Chief of Cavalry; Lt. General S. B. M. Young, 13th Colonel, and later the Army Chief of Staff; Major General Hugh L. Scott, 17th Colonel, and later the Army Chief of Staff; General Jonathan M. Wainwright, 27th Colonel and later hero of Corregidor; General George S. Patton Jr., 28th Colonel, and later the Commanding General of the Third US Army during World War II; and General James H. Polk, 32d Colonel, who assumed command of the United States Army in Europe in 1967. Editor's note: The following were all of the rank of colonel at the time they commanded this regiment.

Each week the society receives a great deal of mail advertising books, services, and societies interested in genealogical research. The literature is made available at meetings on a first-come-first-served basis. A sampling of what has arrived in the last three months follows:

Southern California Genealogical Society (835 Locust, Long Beach 90813) offers its 7th annual SURNAME SEARCHER, 76 pages of over 4,700 surnames, for \$3.00.

Third in a series of Kentucky family histories, reprinted from Perrin's History of Kentucky, is now on the market. Biographical and genealogical sketches from Butler, McLean, Muhlenberg, and Ohio Counties, 224 pages, indexed, from the Genealogical Reference Company, Box 1554, Owensboro KY 42301, for \$11.95.

NORTHAMPTON COUNTY COUSINS (North Carolina) is published by Mrs. Taney Brazeal, Rt. 2, Box 5, Fairhope AL 36532 -- \$5.00/year. Her BRAZEALE NOTES, a quarterly of the Brazeale, Brazell, Braswell etc. Family, is \$3.00/year.

- - NEW BOOKS - -

HAPPY HUNTING GROUNDS, Early Keokuk, Iowa, Marriage Records, Vol. 1. Published by the Lee County Genealogical Society of Iowa, 1966.

Lee County's first marriage records begin in 1837 at the first county seat, Fort Madison, Iowa. However, one book of marriages was kept in the Keokuk Court House from 1848 to 1851, and then no more marriage records are to be found in Keokuk until 1873. All marriages from 1837 to 1851 are transcribed and indexed in this volume, presented to the Tri-City Genealogical Society Library by J. W. Woolsey. It is shelved with the Society's collection at the L.D.S. Branch Library.

THE ANCESTORS AND DESCENDANTS OF JONATHAN SIMMONS AND MARY TROUTMAN AND OF THEIR CHILDREN WHO SETTLED IN WASHINGTON AND OREGON, compiled by Margaret R. and Fred. E. Carver, privately printed, Yakima WA, 1970.

Two hundred forty-three pages of meticulously gathered, carefully indexed records of a family which appeared in Maryland in the 17th Century, carried up to the present through ten generations. This is an expansion of the Carvers' 1967 volume, THE ANCESTORS AND DESCENDANTS OF MICHAEL TROUTMAN SIMMONS AND ANDREW JACKSON SIMMONS. Members of the family came to the Pacific Northwest in 1844. The book was received in exchange for two of the TCGS Indexes to the 1880 Census of Washington Territory and will be added to the Society's collection at the L.D.S. Branch Library. Margaret and Fred. Carver are members of the Yakima Valley Genealogical Society and have been guest speakers for the TCGS.

FROM THE TOWN RECORDS -- WARNING OUT OF TOWN

Genealogy is more than just a search for family records. As you read through early town records, you may learn more about their history and lives than can be found in most history books or historical novels. My curiosity was raised when many town books contained sections (some many pages long) of written requests for the sheriff to warn people out of town. There was no explanation of why, just that the sheriff was not to delay in his duty.

The following accounts are of my 4th-great-grandfather and my 3d-great-grandfather. Please note the dates of these warnings. Would you move into a town where your father was warned out?

To the constable you are hereby requested to summon the widow Gilson, Joseph Adams and the said Adames wife Anna Adams Sam^l Adams Levi Adams John Adams Polly Adams Jerusha Adams and the youngest child of the family not named Now residing in Reading to depart said town fail not...

(dated 3 April 1805)

State of Vermont
Windsor County ss
To Nathan Sherwin Constable of Reading
in the aforesaid county--greeting--you
are hereby requested to summon Sampson Adams & family now residing
in Reading to depart said town here of fail not but of this
receipt (sic) & your doing here in return make according to law --
given under our hand at Reading this 23^d Day of August 1811

(signed) W T Hawkins
Jonth Shead
Daniel Stearns

The above was taken from the town records of Reading, Vermont,
Book II, pages 126 and 98.

Lyman Simpson Hayes, in his book History of the Town of Rockingham, Vermont, published in 1907, gives the meaning for these warnings out of town on pages 100 and 101:

A custom, prevalent to a large extent 100 years ago [1807], was that of "Warning out of town" new comers, for fear they might become town charges. It was in accordance with a statute of the state whereby, if the town so voted, and legal notice was served upon them within the first year of their residence in a town, the persons so warned were prevented from gaining a residence, and the town escaped liability for support should they become dependent.

persons
After this service was made upon them they could never have a legal settlement except by vote of the town . . . or if the person should be elected and serve one year as either selectman, grand juror or lister, the holding of one of these offices would act automatically to relieve the disability created by the "warning out" process.

The process implied nothing whatever against the character of the party, individual or family, and it often happened that such warned persons eventually became wealthy and honored citizens. During the

year 1808, the constables rendered bills to the town for having "warned out" thirty-one families, and in 1809 the number was 26.

Mr. Hayes' account does make sense, because further searching of the Reading, Vermont, records gives the following data on the Adams families:

- Book A, page 338-- "Return of Equipt officers and soldiers in the West Company in the town of Reading"-- included Samuel T. Adams.
In the beginning of the first book of town records there is an 1812 list of taxpayers and taxes paid. Included in this list is: "Joseph Adams, 10th Range, 100 Acres, meaning the lot he now lives on."
Book II, no page given-- Joseph Adams admitted freeman, 4 Sept. 1804-- page 26: Joseph Adams is listed as a voter in Reading-- page 73: Levi P. Adams, voted freeman Sept. 1812.
Book II, page 223: Joseph Adams Jr. & family are warned out of town, 2 March 1819.
Page 269: 20 April 1807, Joseph Sawyer and Anna Adams, both of Reading, were duly married.
Page 292: On 23 June 1811, Levi Adams and Ruth Carlton, both of Reading, were married. Their children listed on this same page: Levi P. Adams Jr., born 15 March 1812; Calvin Carlton Adams, born 7 Oct. 1813; and John Schuyler Adams, born 17 Oct. 1815.
Page 303: On 1 Dec. 1814 Samuel T. Adams and Orinda Brown, both of Reading, were married. Their children listed on this page were: Artemas Warner Adams, born 7 Sept. 1815, and Emily Lurinda Adams, born 21 July 1817.

The following family for Joseph Adams has been compiled from D.A.R. Records in Vermont, Manning's Manning Families from New England, Hazeltine Papers HA114, Index to Vermont Town Records, and the town records of Reading, Vermont.

JOSEPH ADAMS: the father; he had lived at Killingly, where the first six of his children were born. It is not known where Anna was born. The other children were probably all born at Rockingham, Windham, Vermont. Joseph moved with his younger children to Reading, Windsor, Vermont, before 4 Sept. 1804.

JERUSHA _____: the mother, wife of Joseph. The "warning out" lists the mother and wife as "Anna," but Jerusha is the mother of John (born 1798) and it is doubtful that they had a daughter Jerusha, as she is not in the Vermont Index. See Anna, below. -- The children of Jerusha and Joseph Adams:

LUTHER ADAMS: Born 22 March 1769 and married 3 June 1790 to Rhoda _____.

JOSEPH ADAMS: Born 7 April 1772, and married 17 March 1816, at Rockingham, to Anna Emory. The Vermont Index indicates that the mother of his daughter Jerusha was Sarah.

SAMPSON B. ADAMS: Born 16 Feb. 1779, and married 19 Aug. 1801 to Sally Paine (or Payne) at Rockingham. He moved about 1811 from Rockingham to Reading. Manning's book gives the birth of their daughter, Harriet Campbell Adams, as being 18 Nov 1815 at Rockingham. This may be why there is no further mention of this family in the Reading records.

SARAH ADAMS: Born 10 May 1781.

ABIJAH ADAMS: Born 3 April 1783.

RHODA ADAMS: Born 29 Mar. 1785, and married 7 Dec. 1810, at Reading, to Nathan Burt. This is probably the Polly mentioned in the "warning out."

ANNA ADAMS: Born 3 May 1787, and married 20 April 1807, to Joseph Sawyer. The records do not show a daughter Jerusha, so this is probably the daughter Jerusha listed in the "warning out."

LEVI P. ADAMS: Born 4 July 1791, and married 23 June 1811 at Reading to Ruth Carlton.

SAMUEL T. ADAMS: Born 31 Aug. 1794, and married 1 Dec. 1814 at Reading to Orinda Brown.

JOHN ADAMS: Born 6 Aug. 1798.

UNNAMED CHILD: A record for the birth of this child has not been found. The family probably moved from Rockingham before this child's birth was recorded.

- - NEW BRANCH LIBRARY OPEN - -

A second genealogical library has been opened by the Latter Day Saints Churches of the Tri-Cities, this one in the Pasco Stake House at 2424 Road 24. Microfilm holdings of the earlier library in Richland have been divided, with those rolls paid for by Pasco members going to the new branch. Lon Rigby's collection of English Wills and Probate Records has also been moved to Pasco, and there will be further division of film and books. The Tri-City Genealogical Society Collection will remain in Richland.
