## WILL CONSULT REFERENCES:

Elaine Young Wagenaar (Mrs. Gilbert L.) has *Early East Tennessee Tax Lists* by Mary Barnett Curtis, a compiled list of residents of the area covered in 22 East Tennessee counties for which there is no census record prior to 1830 - composed of names appearing on tax lists or petitions for the early 1800's. Her address - 50 Proton, Richland WA 99352.

Dan and Barbara Christenson, Route 1, Box 157A, Outlook WA 98938, have an old and detailed atlas which may provide locations of villages no longer in existence. It is Vol. X of the *Century Dictionary and Cyclopedia (The Century Atlas of the World)*, prepared under the superintendence of Benjamin E. Smith, A.M., published by the Century Company, copyrighted 1889.

-- FIRST RICHLAND PIONEER PICNIC --  
1938

(A word of explanation: While 1938 may seem like yesterday to some of our genealogical friends in New England and Virginia, it has different significance in Eastern Washington. The town was created from virgin sagebrush only in 1905. Those attending the picnic signed their names in a spiral notebook, also used for succeeding picnics through 1941 and once more in 1968, long after the town had been taken over by the Atomic Energy Commission for its Hanford Project.)

The notebook is the property of Brainard Murray and was made available by Martha (Berry) Parker, who is compiling a history of Old Richland.

HUFSTEDLER FAMILY & ALLIED FAMILIES (Believed to Be Descendants of Michael Hochstaedter of the Ship Harle 1736), by Lena Jo Kelly Glaser (Mrs. Alfred W.), 49 W. Providence Road, Lansdowne PA 19050. Printed by Xerox Reproduction Center, Philadelphia PA. Covers period 1736-1974.

Mrs. Glaser has a wealth of Hufstedler information in her 942-page, library-bound book, which also includes allied families of Akers, Bates, Coble, Curl, Harder-Young, Horner-Glare, Kelly, Lemmons, Lomax, McElroy, Penns & Pilands (Pylands), Pope, Pratt-Nations-Weathers-Akers, Randel, Randle, Randall, Stephens-Sutton, Stobaugh, Watson, Whitwell, Wilburn (Wilbourne).

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MASSEY GENEALOGY - Two volumes in one binding: Book I--MY MASSEY FAMILY IN ENGLAND; Book II--MASSEY FAMILIES IN AMERICA, by Judge Frank Massey, published by King & Massey, 2701 Airport Freeway, Fort Worth TX 76111; 1974; 6 x 9, maroon library binding. Book I, 134 pp.; Book II, 283 pp; chapter index each volume; \$20.00. Available from the author: c/o Civil Courts Bldg., Fort Worth TX 76102.

Judge Massey has traced and published his own ancestry to John Massey, 1636 immigrant to Virginia from the Isle of Ely and descendant of Hamon de Masey, first baron of Dunham-Massey, Cheshire, England, at the time of William the Conqueror. As a result of the numerous inquiries received and information accumulated on Masseys/Massies in general, he decided to prepare the MASSEY GENEALOGY so that much research would not be lost and others could determine their own lines.

Book I, MY MASSEY FAMILY IN ENGLAND, is an extensive compiling of early English data on Masseys. Judge Massey visited England in 1971 to complete his research. The book is divided into nine chapters, beginning with the Norman origin of Hamon de Masey in the 11th century and tracing his known descendants through the 17th century. Many genealogical charts are used, and original records and sources are cited throughout the text. There is no name index.

Book II, MASSEY FAMILIES IN AMERICA, is divided into fifteen chapters and contains information on several 17th century Massey immigrants to Virginia and Maryland, their English families, and their descendants in America. Many lines are traced to the 19th century. There is a short chapter on 1630 immigrant Geoffrey Massey of Salem, ancestor of Raymond Massey, the actor. The last two chapters comprise over 100 pages of 18th and 19th century data such as census records, courthouse records, etc. in Tennessee and more than fifteen other states.

As in Book I, there is no name index. Perhaps this can be rectified at some future date. With the wealth of data contained in these 417 pages of Massey genealogy, an index would easily warrant a separate publication.

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- - PEDIGREE CHARTS - -

Charts used in this department are those of members and their spouses. Numbering is that used on most commercial pedigree charts. The person submitting the chart is 1, his father is 2, his mother is 3, and his paternal grandfather 4. A person's father is always twice his own number, and his mother's number is his own, doubled, plus one. The original rule of publishing only through ancestor 31 has been suspended, and members may submit new material continuing charts already printed.

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-- THE 1900 CENSUS --

(A letter from Dale Denham, T.C.G.S. member who recently moved from Richland WA to Philadelphia PA, to Margaret Rice contains so much of interest to all that we are reproducing part of it here.)

. . . I've been out of town quite a bit in the past few weeks, getting acquainted with the nuclear power companies for whom we are doing business. I've had 2 trips to Washington DC, hoping to get to the National Archives. I made it on my last trip this past week. I had my first chance to check the 1900 census. So far, except for the red tape, it seems to be more than worthwhile. . . I found one of my Denhams on the first try, including the fact that the family had finally left home, except for the then 17-year-old daughter.

System for using the 1900 Census schedules at the National Archives and Records Service Center:

1. Register with name and address (including local in D.C.)
2. Check files (indexes by state) for "T" number and "Roll" number; these are on the soundex system so I looked for D-550, in this case in Nebraska. (Apparently these soundex files cover an entire state; I searched for the D-550 portion of the microfilm roll and found these to be arranged alphabetically by the given names; all of the surnames were of the Denham, Durham, Dunham, Denam etc. variety.)
3. Use the microfilm files of the specific county and state as we were used to in Richland at the LDS Library.

The kinds of information found on the soundex rolls (item 2 above):

Name of head of household

Volume, Sheet #, Enumeration District (E.D.), and line # from the original census.

Color of individual; age of individual

Month and year of birth of individual as well as state of birth

Place of residence at time of census (Example: 2579 Cuming St., Omaha, Douglas County, Nebraska)

Precinct or Township (if not in city)

Other members of family by given name(s), ages, places of birth, and month and year of birth.

(Thus you can see, the soundex films contain a wealth of information and in a somewhat indexed fashion with all counties for a given state included on the same roll. I have not tried, because I only had one hour at the Archives, the actual census films themselves, but most standard references show what additional information can be gleaned therefrom. In my case I hope to check the originals because of spelling differences and possible other families living in adjacent homes.) Each time you want a new roll, they have to fill out a separate form and also unlock the cabinets.

-- OLD CLIPPINGS WELCOME --

Mrs. Wes Lartigue of the Eastern Washington Genealogical Society, Spokane, has sent the T.C.G.S. a bundle of yellowed newspaper clippings of articles apparently sent to Spokane papers by their correspondents in Pasco, Eltopia, and Connell between 1910 and 1934. While many of them are of general interest only, referring to scheduled band practices or the prospect of good crops, some contain many names of possible genealogical interest.

Excitement was running high on May 3, 1913, about the merchants' carnival. Those running for queen and princess were Maude Hulbert, Osie McKee, Nettie Hays, Sadie McDevitt, Josephine Kouba, Zella Jewell, Celeste Suite, Elsa Dixon, Bessie Calicott, Frances Enke, and 22 others, not named.

Conductors were involved in a contest for a gold lantern -- D. E. Doyle, H. Thompson, and Fred Spencer -- and engineers competing for a gold watch -- J. A. Buch, D. E. Smith, George Wilson, and T. Griffith.

The same day, J. E. Doughty and A. F. Wehe were to report on plans to open a public market in Pasco.

On Oct. 8, 1911, B. K. Short, Charles Giezentanner and Robert Jahnke went to Walla Walla "to greet President Taft and tag him with a silk tag asking the irrigating of Franklin County."

The largest class yet graduated from the Pasco high school, on May 30, 1913, consisted of eight graduates, Harry Ask, Frank Bertholet, Glenna Kays, Mary McKinley, Ruby Moore, Mabel Reasoner, Harold Robinson, and Harold Small. Diplomas were given by D. W. Fales, the class march was played by James Blanton, and the invocation was given by the Rev. J. D. Bird.

Benjamin Rosencrance, last veteran of the Civil War in Franklin County, was buried at Pasco November 28, 1934. He had been a stock raiser in the Walla Walla country and a railroad right-of-way grader in the Kennewick area. He was survived by his widow, three daughters, five grandchildren, a grandniece and a great-great-grandniece.
