-- NEW BIRTH CERTIFICATE LAW FOR WASHINGTON --

Reproduced, with permission, from Olympia Genealogical Society Quarterly, April 1979, Olympia WA.

At this writing it appears that House Bill No. 4, which requires that birth certificates for adopted children be made identical to those for natural children, will become law. This means that the adopted child will be represented on the birth certificate as a "natural" child, and no evidence will show the true fact.

The barrier thus presented to genealogists is obvious. The true genealogy of an adopted child will be made virtually impossible to discover, and many erroneous pedigrees will result.

This is, perhaps, the only kind of situation in which a law has been passed which makes perjury a virtue, and truth illicit. This has ominous portent in our society.

A more serious result, perhaps, is the implication contained in the term "genealogy," which derives from the Latin "genus," meaning "origin, race, species, kind," related to the Latin "genesis," meaning "birth, generation," and to "genetics," from the same root. It is known that many diseases are hereditary. Cystic fibrosis, diabetes, and some mental disorders are known to be genetically related. When a child bears the tendency toward one of these diseases, knowledge of such history can allow early diagnosis, which in turn gives the medical profession the greatest opportunity to combat the disease. Some diseases of genetic origin may not be evident until the victim is mature. When no genealogical information is recorded, will these unwitting victims be denied the rights which "natural" children can expect without question?

As a Society, we cannot work to affect legislation, for fear of losing our status as a tax-exempt organization. As individuals, however, we can, and must, contact our legislators and express our displeasure with laws which reverse basic values, extolling falsehood and denigrating truth.

Nothing can be done until the next session of the Legislature--but let us not forget.

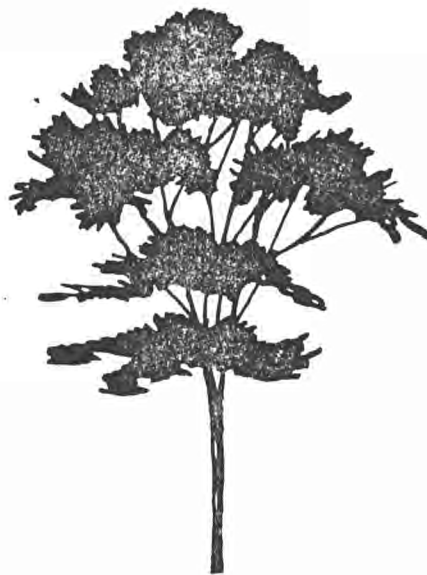

Mr. Walker has been a popular speaker at workshops throughout the country. His presentations are called "always new and sparkling. He loves to point out the hidden, unused sources we usually overlook."
