The Townsends give great emphasis to the fact that they are as interested in families that have intermarried with the Griswolds as with the Griswold lines themselves. Many specially set up Griswold family group sheets, lots of book reviews, and one of Mrs. T's helpful columns on research in general. Review copy received.

Laybourne, William H. and Harland Ayres Laybourn, THE LAYBOURN(E) FAMILY, privately published by W. H. Laybourne, 4204 N. 78th Way, Scottsdale AZ 85251, 1979. xx, 142 pp., hard cover, a few photos, several pedigree charts. Gift to the society from Hal Laybourn of Richland, co-author.

Professionally typeset and well printed in brown ink on heavy ivory paper, this is a handsome book. The research, based on an earlier study by William H. Laybourne's father Stanley, appears to be carefully done back to the immigrant, Christopher Laybourn, and his wife, Margaret Newlove. There is, however, almost no documentation presented. The family line in England is extremely hard to follow. Transcripts of two letters from the Somerset Herald of Arms at the College of Arms in London refer to "typed pedigrees enclosed," but none of the pedigrees in the book appear to be copies of these. Some kind of generation—and—individual numbering system would have made the book easier to follow, and the lack of an index is always to be deplored.

VA in 1782, paying 6,000 pounds of tobacco for it. Died 1820 or 1821 in Albemarle Co. VA. Married HULDA DABNEY?

Mrs. McElroy has a copy of a letter written to Glenn Johnson 10 Dec. 1978 by Mrs. Melvin Dant, R. R. 3, Princeton 1L 61356, some of which is in conflict with information given above. It is quoted here, in part:

. . . Much time, effort and money have been spent on trying to learn something about Bartelott Ellis. From Census Records and deeds etc., it is believed that Bartelott is the father of Dabney Ellis. Dabney is my gr-gr-grandfather. He was born circa 1780 in Albemarle Co. VA, married Frances Watson there in Mar. 1808. Left Va. for Ill. in 1830 and came to Bureau Co., Ill. in 1833 where he lived near Dover until his death in 1840. His wife survived him for more than 40 years. She was born in Ky. but moved to Albemarle Co. when she was one year old — this by 1789. The 7 children of this couple were born in Albemarle Co.; they came with their parents to Bureau Co. Three of these, Abbott, my gr-grandfather, and two of his sisters, Frances and Martha, continued to make their homes in this county and died here.

Deeds have named Thomas and John B as sons of Bartelott. However Bartelott deeded land to Dabney and apparently they owned land adjacent to each other. No will was found in Albemarle Co. and it is assumed he moved to Ky. where he bought 400 acres of land on Seven Mile Creek near the Ohio River. This deed of Oct. 1818. No county in Ky. was mentioned but the deed recorded in Albemarle Co. for the purchase of Ky. land by Bartelott Ellis. In 1822 the deed for this land was delivered to Thomas Ellis as B.'s attorney. Perhaps Bartelott died by the 1822 date. Piecemeal, Bartelott may have had a daughter Hulda who died by Dec. 1828. Hulda left in her will articles to her Mother Mary and to her sister Polly. To confirm my belief, there are many land transactions between John B., Thomas and Dabney in Albemarle Co., and so I assume that these three were brothers.

I have a letter written by Thomas Ellis to his brother Dabney dated July 20, 1835. The return is difficult to read but HARDINS is quite legible but the next word Ban or Tarr with the third perhaps Co. Anyhow, in the letter Thomas tells of difficult financial times in Virginia and that he would like to come to Ill. However, they had just had their 8th child who was 4 months old and named Wm. Johnson Ellis. He also writes of a Sunday School at Brick Chapel at Flat Rock. He further writes that he has not heard from Joel Ellis for a long time. He also writes of George Craig. In Abbott Ellis' diary, Abbott records that Uncle George Craig came to Ill. to visit and returned to his Virginia home.

From marriage records John B. Ellis married Malinda Maupin, 1805. Dabney married 1808 and Thomas did not marry Mary Ballard until 1821. I assumed that Thomas was one of the younger sons. Yet this can not be true as you have the 1776 year of birth for Thomas; he must have married late in life. . . .

From HARRIET ELLIS JOHNSON's scrapbook comes this hand-written bit of ELLIS history:

"It was Lewis County, West Virginia, where Father was born. He came to Kansas with his parents when he was four years old. They first settled near Ottawa and later moved to the Quaker Community. Grandfather JOHN ELLIS helped to build the Quaker Church which now stands there. Mother's father (my grandfather JAMES DUNBAR) helped to build the first Quaker Church, which was made of logs. Grandfather JOHN ELLIS had a post office in his house. The P.O. was Mt. Nebo, Kansas. When my father was a young man he carried the mail (by pony

express--horse back) from Mt. Nebo to LeRoy one day and back the next. Fred's father (ISAAC JOHNSON) carried the mail from Mt. Nebo to Osawatomie one day and back the next (by pony express). HAZEL ELLIS EASTWOOD says that the P.O. pigeon holes were there at the old homestead when her folks, UNCLE BERT's family, still lived there. My, couldn't a great history book have been written about their lives! (Too late now.)"

Dated Wed., Mar. 15, 1967.

THOMAS ELLIS - Fought in the War of 1812. West from Albemarle Co. VA (Charlottesville) to Lewis Co. VA, now WVA, about 1833. Died there and is buried in the ELLIS-FINSTER CEMETERY there. Has joint tombstone placed by son GEORGE D. ELLIS about 1893 or 1894.

JOHN T., 1826-1888, mar. LUCINDA KEITH, both buried ELLIS family cemetery, Kansas.

MARTHA J., 1832-___, mar. JOHN M. LONG, lived in West Virginia, Kansas PATSY, 1833-

WILLIAM J., 1835-____, mar. HARRIET --?--, lived West Virginia, Kansas GEORGE D., 1837-1911, mar. TELITHA STAFFORD, both buried Boise ID JAMES, 1840-18__, killed in Civil War, Federal Army

COLUMBUS (C. A.), 1842-1858, buried ELLIS-FINSTER cemetery, West Virginia.

JOHN T. ELLIS - Probably born in Albemarle Co. VA, as his older brother was born there and Thomas did not buy land in Lewis Co., now West Virginia, until 1833. Married LUCINDA KEITH December 1851, Lewis Co. Migrated to Kansas Territory in 1856, first near Ottawa and then to Lykins Co., now Miami Co., in what became the Quaker community. Homesteaded on two land claims. Died there. Both are buried in the Ellis family cemetery on the homestead.

CHARLES ALONZO (Lon), 1852-1930, mar. MARIAH A. DUNBAR, both buried Quaker Cemetery.

FLORA (Code), 1859-1937, mar. ALBERT CROWL, both buried Scott City KS HATTIE, 1863-1890, mar. JOHN P. WELLS; Hattie buried Ellis family cemetery JAMES, 1866-1881, unmarried, buried Lane KS

LILLIE (Dick), 1869-1938, mar 1) ELMER E. WELLS, 2) JOHN CHITWOOD. Lillie and John buried Lane KS

ALBERT G. (Bert), 1872-1951, mar. ROSA BURNER, both buried Lane KS THADDEUS (Thad), 1874-1942, mar. AUSTIE TUEL, both buried Lane KS. (Records show AUGUSTA.)

ALBERT G. (BERT) ELLIS - Born 29 June 1872 on the John Ellis homestead and continued to live there all his life. Married ROSA BELLE BURNER 29 June 1898. County commissioner for a number of years and a leader in the community. Died 19 May 1951. ROSA died 30 October 1951. Both buried Lane Cemetery. He was the last survivor of seven children.

HAZEL M., born 1899, mar. HENRY EASTWOOD, lives in California FLOYD G. (BOB), 1901-1951, buried Lane KS EARL CLAUDE, 1910-1968, mar. EVELYNN GLENN, buried California Lee Ellis, son of Earl Claude, and Lee's wife Margaret Dorothy Anderson (Peggy) have a complete list of the descendants of Albert and Rosa Ellis. CLARENCE W., born 1913, mar. BESSIE BARKER, lives in California.

Remember the letter from Netti Schreiner-Yantis, president of the National Genealogical Society, about dispersal of the National Archives in Washington DC? It was reprinted in the October TCGS BULLETIN. Your letters of protest were effective. The Winter 1980 Newsletter of the NGS included this letter to Mrs. Yantis:

Dear Mrs. Schreiner-Yantis:

I have just seen a copy of the January 18 memo sent by you and Rabbi Malcolm Stern to the members of the National Genealogical Society.

Because of the concern demonstrated by individual researchers and by organizations such as yours, we have suspended the dispersal of records from Washington to regional branches. We will review the records originally recommended for dispersal and will be consulting appropriate users of the records for their views.

You may be assured that there is no intention of disrupting research or of making it more difficult. You also have my assurance that the National Genealogical Society will be consulted before any dispersal of records is resumed.
