

SAINTS HOME CEMETERY

WHITMAN COUNTY, WASHINGTON

Located on the Davis Farm on Saints Home Road 7 miles south of Colfax, Washington, on the Pullman-Colfax Highway. It is about 4 miles from the Highway and one mile from the Lang Ranch. Copied by Mr. and Mrs. Lawrence Gurney, they also have a plot map of the cemetery giving the names of all persons interred. Vandalism and weather has taken its toll of the tombstones.
