Judy Carlson of Wausa presented a very interesting and enjoyable program for the evening telling about her search of cemeteries in and around Knox County and of other cemeteries she had the privilege to visit while on vacation. She has published a book, "Buried on the Prairies of Knox County, a History of Pioneer Cemeteries in and Around Knox County." This book is available in the museum gift shop for purchase.

October Meeting and Program Notes by Patty Eucker

The Madison County Genealogical Society met October 18, 2005 at the Elkhorn Valley Museum and Research Center with 17 members and one guest present.

Nanette Day, the new director of the museum was introduced.

The boxes of files and clippings from Oregon arrived. To save on shipping, we had them remove the manila file folders and just separate each group with a colored sheet of paper. If anyone wants to help put them back into file folders please stop in the library. It saved about \$50 in shipping, cutting the amount from 7 boxes to 5 boxes and shipping from about \$150 to \$100. So far many of the names are easily recognizable as Madison County and Norfolk area names and we're still on the first box of files.

A video "Identifying and Dating Your Family Photographs," was shown for our program, but due to the length we only watched half of it and will view the other half at a later meeting or you may check it out and view it at home.

Gleanings

From October 1831 through October 1921, the Boston *Pilot* newspaper printed a "Missing Friends" column with advertisements from people looking for "lost" friends and relatives who had emigrated from Ireland to the United States. This extraordinary collection of more than 31,438 records is available now as a searchable online database sponsored by Boston College.

The advertisements contain the ordinary but revealing details about the missing person's life: the county and parish of their birth, when they left Ireland, the believed port of arrival in North America, their occupation, and a range of other personal information. Some records may have as many as 50 different data fields, while others may offer only a few details. The people who placed ads were often anxious family members in Ireland, or the wives, siblings, or parents of men who followed construction jobs on railroads or canals.

Well, it was voted at the last meeting to pay the shipping for the Wainwright collection of genealogy from Linn County, Oregon. It arrived and library volunteers are working organizing it. The collection arrived in 5 boxes. We had them remove the manila folders and just place a colored sheet of paper between each file. This cut the shipping from 7 boxes to 5. Now we are putting them back into manila file folders, and labeling each folder with all of the last names in each file. Many of them overlap with the same names on many files. These include many Norfolk area names that are instantly recognizable. There are 4 boxes of individual files and the fifth box has collections of obits, etc. glued onto paper, with each bunch tied together. If your family names turn out to be included here it will be an awesome jump for you. This lady has documented every letter she has written and received, as well as every bit of her source materials. Her genealogy collection is a model for what we should all be doing for documentation. It will be awhile yet before we are done sorting, cataloging and filing. Eventually all of these files will be cataloged into the computer system. Stay tuned...

Cancer
 It's Proper Treatment and Cure
 1931

Escharotic Treatment, Founded in 1896 by Perry Nichols, M. D.

This book was found in some donated materials. It is of little value for it's information on cancer today, but in it are a list of the many patients that have been cured and also testimonials from patients that were treated at Dr. Nichols Sanatorium in Savannah, Missouri. The patients included from Northeast Nebraska have been listed here. Also included is some information on the Nichols Sanitarium and their policies as it is quite interesting to read in comparison to today's practice of "modern medicine."

From the Savannah, Missouri web site:

The Nichols Sanatorium had treated 3300 patients up to 1918, and by 1956 the list had grown to 70,000. Many medical doctors did not recognize the Sanatorium as a valid medical institution, but the thousands of people who came to Savannah as a last resort and almost without hope, and who left after treatment to live for many years in comfort, seemed to be sufficient proof that this place did relieve suffering and that it added years to the lives of those who were treated.

Dr. Nichols died in September 1925 and the Sanatorium passed into the hands of his daughter, Mrs. Helen Nichols Poston. It continued in business for several years after Dr. Nichols' death. In 1956 it was sold to the Sisters of St. Francis, an order of Catholic nuns dedicated to the care of the aged. They came to Savannah in 1957 and established their motherhouse in the main building of the former Dr. Nichols' Sanatorium. In a short time they began to admit elderly women to their Retirement Home on the upper floors. The name was changed and the community "at the foot of the Christian Ridge" became La Verna Heights, which is still running today.
