## Greetings from our Madison County Genealogical Society

Our May 17th meeting Saturday morning at the Elkhorn Valley Museum quickly covered topics of interest, adjourning at 11 o'clock so members could prepare for and attend school graduation activities on this busy weekend.

Researchers gave query details, and provided articles to be used in future newsletters. Recent ancestral histories received included names in the Kuhl-Kluckhohn and Muffly-Funk-Church families, as well as a query from Germany on Klawonn in Madison County.

Members told of the experiences and difficulties in maintaining very old cemeteries located on original farm homesteads, with the question remaining — whose responsibility is the maintenance of such cemeteries when there is no longer a family member surviving to take an interest. Too often such cemeteries are plowed up and farmed over, with stones discarded, and the record becoming lost to the public.

Our June 21st meeting adjourned early to allow members to attend Chautauqua events, but we were happy to extend a warm welcome to the new Director of the Elkhorn Valley Museum and Research Center, Ryan Leichenauer.

Our July 19th meeting will be held as usual at the Elkhorn Valley Museum, 10 o'clock, with lunch following.

### **SOCIETY NOTES;**

June was busy in Norfolk. June 11-14th the Great American Comedy Festival, honoring legendary Johnny Carson, entertained young and old with comedy and magic in the Johnny Carson Theater, our Elkhorn Valley Museum, Divot's, and Norfolk businesses, with downtown street comics interacting with the children. Timely for the festivities, Norfolk artist Karl Reeder created an outdoor mural depicting Carson and some of his notable characters.

The Greater Omaha Genealogical Society Seminar on June 28th, held at the Nebraska Methodist College in Omaha was attended by several of our members. Gail Blankenau, professional genealogist, gave helpful tips and information on researching German Parish Records. Her program covered new techniques and methods to research parish records, as well as the terminology used, with words of encouragement on deciphering German script (which is often a great challenge requiring professional assistance).

### **MEMBER RESEARCH;**

Margery Fuhrmann was pleased to receive in May, 2014 new data on her German research on a female relative, A. Zirkler, married to August Eyl, Zellerfeld, Southeast of Hannover. Earlier Zirkler surnames ca 1700s in Alsace-Lorraine; 1800s Hannover. Names in her German and United States research: Becker or Baker in Hannover Province to 1847, 1864 in Will Co., Ill, married D. Knapp, searching for her parents. Eyl or Eyle 1854 in Hannover, 1863 Maryland and Indiana, 1866 Missouri, 1869 in Nebraska. Dan Knapp, Rheinland-Pfals, Bavaria to 1854, 1871 Will Co., Ill, and 1871 to Madison Co., NE-father and son. Prauner/Praeuner 1620 to date, Wustenau, Wurttemberg, Germany, 1869 to date Nebraska. **A Little Genealogical Humor!!****GENEALOGICAL HISTORICAL FACTS MEET POLITICAL SPIN**

Judy Harper, an amateur genealogy researcher in Northern Ontario, was doing some personal work on her own family tree. She discovered that Prime Minister Stephen Harper's great-great uncle, Remus Rudd, was hanged for horse stealing and train robbery in Winnipeg in 1889. Both Judy and Stephen Harper share this common ancestor.

The only known photograph of Remus shows him standing on the gallows at the Manitoba Provincial jail. On the back of the picture Judy obtained during her research is this inscription:

Remus Judd horse thief, sent to Stoney Mountain Jail 1885, escaped 1887, robbed the CP and CN Trains six times. Caught by Mounted Police Force, convicted and hanged in 1889.

So Judy emailed Prime Minister Harper for information about their great-great uncle, Remus Rudd. Believe it or not, Harper's staff sent back the following biographical sketch for her genealogy research:

Remus Rudd was famous in Ontario during the mid to late 1800's. His business empire grew to include acquisition of valuable equestrian assets and intimate dealings with the CP and CN Railways.

Beginning in mid 1880's he devoted several years of his life to government service, finally taking leave to resume his dealings with the railroads.

In 1887 he was a key player in a vital investigation run by the Mounted Police Force. In 1889 Remus passed away during an important civic function held in his honor, when the platform upon upon which he was standing collapsed.

**Martin Kane, Former Police Chief, Dies**  
**Funeral Rites for long time Norfolk resident will be Friday**

Death at 1:30 o'clock Tuesday afternoon ended the picturesque career of Martin Kane, 75, former officer and chief on the Norfolk police force, who died at his home, 113 South Thirteenth street, following a long illness. Funeral services will be held at 9:30 o'clock Friday morning at Sacred Heart church, with the Rev. Hugh Gately, pastor, officiating.

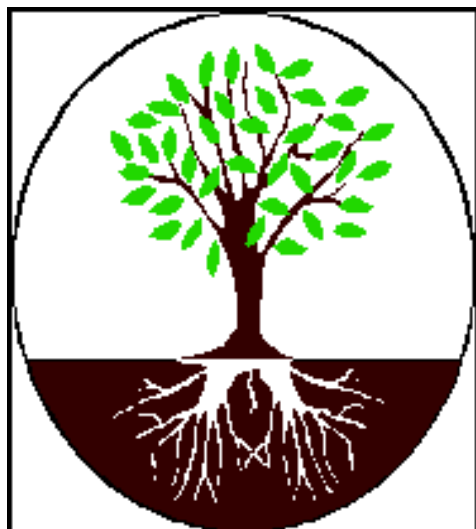
Mr. Kane was born in Scranton, Pa., and came westward at an early age. He had been a well known figure in Norfolk since his years of active service on the police force, from which he resigned many years ago. Mr. Kane served through the early days in Norfolk, when this city was the center of one of the boldest gangs of robbers and thugs who have ever been hunted down by law. He was through many a fierce gun battle and was the direct cause of putting at least a hundred convicts into striped clothing.

It was Officer Martin Kane who hunted down the Carson outfit, a band of robbers who operated throughout Stanton county, and sent them all to the Lincoln penitentiary. It was he who got the Eddies, another band with headquarters here, and secured prison sentences for them. He is also credited with the capture of the Clark outfit, another burglar gang. During his entire service, Officer Kan was never hurt in the slightest particular. He never killed a man, although he shot at dozens. During three years of constant night service he never missed a single night's watching and during his whole career no prisoner ever escaped from him when once caught.

Survivors are three daughters, Mrs. Nellie Welsch of Sioux City, Ia., Mrs. Mary Schully of Chicago, Mrs. Margaret Whisman of Sioux City, Ia., and three sons, William and Martin Jr., both of Norfolk, and James Kane.

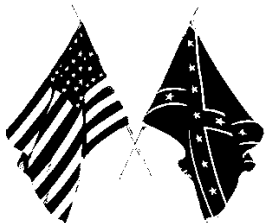
