CONRAD FAMILY--- The Conrads were another German family determined to escape the rigors of life under the mandates of the autocratic religious and feudal systems by emigrating to America. Michael Conrad was born about 1808 in the village of Zaeckerick, Kreis Koenigsberg in Prussia. On October 29, 1835 he married Anna Sophie Zeuschner, born in 1807 in Prussia. By the time they embarked for America in 1853 their family was already well along with children: Henriette Louise, born 1835, Sophie Wilhelmine, born 1837, Carl Ferdinand, born 1838, Auguste Louise, born 1842, Therese August, born 1844, and Marie Mathilde, born 1847. Wisconsin was

their destination and daughter Anna S. was born in 1855 in Jefferson County, where they had taken up farming.

It is interesting to note that Michael signed his Intention to become a citizen of the United States, in Jefferson County, Wisconsin, dated Oct. 24, 1886, although he was one of the settlers with the wagon trains heading for Nebraska in 1866. He was dedicated to his new homeland and conscientious, so for the record he also filed his Intention in Madison County when he applied for his homestead.

Michael Conrad's Homestead Patent dated June 30, 1876, recorded May 3, 1884, covers 160 acres on the S ½ of NW ¼ and N ½ of SW ¼ of Section 3-T 23N-R 1W. This original homestead is located east of Highway 81, northeast of the present Karl Stefan Airfield. They farmed here many years, but by 1880 they were farming and living with their daughter, Mathilde and her husband, Julius Hoehne. Growing up in the Norfolk settlement Conrad children and grandchildren farmed and worked in Norfolk businesses, including grocery and meat markets.

So it was not surprising that Michael and Sophie's grandson, Ernest Emil Conrad (1888-1952), a successful farmer, wanted to make his livestock products more available to the public. The Central Meat Market at 406 Norfolk Avenue, with his name E. E. Conrad on the front awning, was the logical

answer and a great success. Above the store the picturesque bold copper relief of a sheep, cow and pig was the telltale sign the Karo Brothers had placed there when they opened their sausage factory in late 1880s. It was good fortune for the community that Ernest took over and operated his 'fresh meat' market during the years 1913 to about 1920, when the family moved to Naper, Nebraska, and a somewhat easier lifestyle. The Central Meat Market had many loyal shoppers and continued under several different owners-- Emil A. Dossow, and then the Roman's Market from 1922 until 1946, when Roman moved the market to his meat packing plant on South 13th Street. After that Ed Harmel had his Uptown Market there. But times changed for the original brick structure of 1892 which August and Fred Karo had built for their sausage factory. In the 1950s Jack Nisker operated his stylish shoe and accessory shop there for about 30 years. Today the unique historical sign no longer highlights the building, but it will not be forgotten. Trendy entertainment was there for a time, but today the building with its signature 'red high heels' is better suited specializing in quality consignment clothing.

Ernest Emil was the last of the 13 children of Carl Ferdinand and Louisa Huebner Conrad. Carl Ferdinand emigrated with parents Michael and Anna Sophie Conrad in 1853, and married Louisa Huebner January 4, 1865, in Wisconsin. She was the daughter of Christian and Johanna (Lehman) Huebner, and was born October 19, 1846 in Ixonia. Carl Ferdinand and Louise homesteaded and farmed west of Hadar, Nebraska in 1869, and raised their family—their children: Lydia F; Amanda Emilie; Bernadine; Leonardardt G; Arthur F; Agatha and Agnes-twins; Louis Heinrich and Luella Martha.—twins; Arnold Emil; and Ernest Emil who later put his livestock and farming know-how to profitable use in the meat business.

Ernest Emil Conrad and Grace Gertrude Hight, born in White River, S. D., were married May 5, 1913, in Norfolk, Nebraska. They farmed in Naper, Nebraska, after leaving the meat market business, and later moved to California. Ernest Emil and Grace Conrad had one child, a son Ernest Glen, born February 27, 1921 in Winner, South Dakota. Ernest Glen graduated from Naper High School in 1939, and also moved to California, the Santa Monica area. He attended college, and was in the Navy as a chief radio officer. He taught electronics and mathematics at Long Beach City College. He married in 1941 and has 4 daughters, one of whom is Cheryn Conrad Gray, who is a member of our society. Cheryn and her husband Robert live in Palos Verdes, California.

Ernest Emil died May 24, 1952 in Venice, California. Grace (Hight) Conrad died in California in 1985, and both Ernest and Grace are buried in the Inglewood Park Cemetery, Inglewood, Ca. Ernest Glen Conrad, Cheryn's dad died in 1989 and is also at the Inglewood Park Cemetery. Her mother is still living at 93.

Louisa (Huebner) Conrad died October 9, 1919. Carl Ferdinand died August 10, 1925, at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Charles Apfel, Meadow Grove, Nebraska. Both Louisa and Carl Ferdinand are buried in the Immanuel Cemetery, Hadar, Nebraska. (Carl) Ferdinand Conrad's name is included on the memorial monument honoring the 1866 pioneers in Liberty Bell Park on Georgia Avenue and 6th Street in Norfolk, Nebraska.

Anna Sophie (Zeuschner) Conrad, was born in 1807 in Prussia, and died June 10, 1888, in Norfolk. Michael Conrad, born June 28, 1807, in Zaeckerick, Prussia (this may have been Pomerania), and died February 28, 1890, in Norfolk. Both are buried in St. Paul's Lutheran Cemetery in Norfolk, Nebraska.

Some of the pioneer names in the Conrad family lines include: Huebner, Apfel, Hille, Rohde, Hoenne, Lehman, Walker, Miller, Korth, Saeger, Wagner and others, which are well known throughout northeast Nebraska. The Hight family surnames trace back to England.

The Norfolk Veterans Home has built a fabulous new Veterans Memory Plaza where you may purchase a tile to honor any veteran, living or deceased. There are three styles of tiles currently available. One style can be linked to a website where you can upload unlimited data, photos, movies, songs, etc. of your veteran. The second style has only the veteran's photo and service dates. The third option is no photo but the veteran's name and dates of service. There is room for more than 2000 tiles. At present there are slightly more than 300 tiles installed. This veterans memorial is beautiful with the flags, engraved benches, life size bronze statues and an eternal flame. At 67 I became interested in finding my “roots”. I and my sister, Judy, remember bit’s and pieces of what my Grandmother said, so off to the races I went. I found that most of my relatives are Nebraska natives, in particular to the Newman Grove/Emerick area. Our family history on the Morgan side is well represented in Newman Grove’s Centennial publication. At this time I’m at a snag on finding my 3xs Great Grandfather, Guilson Morgan’s, place of birth in 1798 (+/-) in Connecticut, or his parents.



What I have become interested in is finding any relative from Newman Grove that may have the original photo’s of the family. I have a few Xerox copies I found in my Grandmother’s photo album but she did not have the originals. Who does? If you recognize these photos and know where the originals might be would be an awesome help.

My family is Morgan/Vogt/Froding/Sandin. My father is Robert Lee Sandin, Grandfather Arthur C. Sandin (Lottie Wallen) Grandmother Mildred Caroline Vogt. My Great Grandfather is Guilson “Gip” Vogt and Great Grandmother is Julia Froding. My GG Grandfather is Henry Vogt, and GG Grandmother is Ann Morgan-Moon. My GGG Grandfather is Dr. Guilson Morgan and GGG Grandmother is Fidelia Barrow Morgan-McCartney.

My 3xs Great Grandfather is still buried on the old homestead, northeast of Newman Grove and my Great Grandfather, Gip Vogt owned the hardware and feed store in Newman Grove from the early 20s until his death in 1950. My cousin, Jackie Otto still lives in Albion.

Greetings from the Madison County Genealogical Society

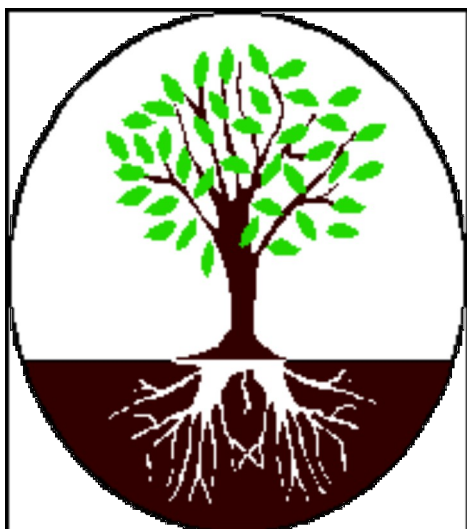

Cheryl Richardson who is researching in western Nebraska, brought her volume on Sioux County, by the Arphax Publishing Company of Norman, Oklahoma. This is a huge inventory of the county records including surname lists, land ownership records with patents, township indexes and plats—literally all the records of great value to researchers. A check of the Arphax inventory, unfortunately, showed no such county record book for Madison County or any of our area of Nebraska at this time. Another member, Pamela Freudenburg, distributed copies of the Nebraska Territorial Pioneer Association surname index published in 1910, another valuable reference work.
