Her first husband was **Rudolph Adolph Mittelstadt**, a brother to my grandmother, **Hulda Matilda Mittelstadt Schmode**, and he passed away on Feb 28, 1943. He was a dentist. In 1944 Fern married my grandfather, **Henry A. Schmode**, who had just recently lost his wife, my grandmother. It is at this point that Fern and I became very close friends. Fern passed away around 1970 in Scottsbluff, Nebraska, and I have not been able to determine the exact date she passed away or her final place of burial. Hi, My name is Ruth Norris and I am looking for information on Alice E Cuplin, daughter of Matilda Ann & John G Cuplin. Alice was born Feb 9 1868 in Wisconsin and was said to have died of Diphtheria in 1887. She was my great aunt. I have looked in all of the cemeteries they have listed so far in Madison Co. on the web with no luck. I need the date of her death and the name of the cemetery if possible. I found her. Alice E. Cuplin died September 7, 1887. Buried in Allberry Cemetery. Allberry is southwest of Norfolk a little ways. It used to be affiliated with the Methodist Church but it now belongs to the County and the county maintains it and uses it for county burials. There are no existing cemetery records. There must however be a marker as that is what we walked and recorded originally.

There are no existing newspapers either before 1888 for Norfolk, so highly unlikely that any obit would be found.

Haines query and response

An email request was received from Susan Haines seeking information on David Haines died in Clarion, Madison Co. about Dec. 12, 1876 and his burial location, his wife Emily Jane Haines seeking her death and burial location, and any obituary or probate information and photographs of any grave sites. They are buried in Fairview Cemetery along with a granddaughter Emma Haines. Their markers are very clear and readable including inscriptions. No probate record was found for David but Emily J. had a very extensive probate file including signed affidavits from grown children, mortgage deed and even the order for her cemetery marker. Emily died Mar. 3, 1886, and David died Dec. 10, 1876. The Madison paper is on microfilm at the Elkhorn Valley Museum, however the one issue needed from 1876 was missing and the entire year of 1886 was missing except for one issue (the wrong one) so no obituary was found. A short history of Fairview was sent along with 60 pages from the probate file and photographs of the cemetery markers.

Query 1870, Haaren, Westphalen, Germany.

Neighbors and relatives (the families Ernesti, Gerken, Goeken, Hagedorn, Kaup, Knievel, Muller, Schulte, Thiele, and others) have already gone or are discussing going to America—to a place called Nebraska.

Do we go or do we stay, the couple agonizes. *How can we leave our two children behind?* Within the past five years, they had buried two of their five children. *Can you leave behind your only son? Can we leave behind our parents, our brothers and sisters?*

Their next decision when and how to sail to America. Bremen is the closest port, 200 miles away. Hamburg, 50 miles farther. *What time of year do we leave? To what port do we sail? Then, how do we travel to Nebraska?*

There are no travel agencies in 1870 Germany. But Hermann and Margaretha Toelle know from their neighbors that others have sailed to New York City, others to New Orleans. Some cross America in wagons, by rail, or on a large river called the Mississippi, which meets with another river called the Missouri.

Unfortunately, our family historians have been unable to find the Toelle's itinerary or their names in the ship passenger lists.

What is known is that Hermann, Margaretha, and their three daughters left Haaren sometime between February, 1870, and February, 1871, when the first Toelle child was born in the US— Emma, who was born in the State of Missouri, on the way to Nebraska.

It is also known that immigrants to the same destination tended to travel via routes previously traveled by family and friends.

I would like to ask descendants of Haaren immigrants to the West Point area to share with me their ancestors' stories about their travels to America. With shared knowledge comes facts that can assist us all in better honoring and knowing our ancestors.
